A section of the City's main thoroughfare, University Drive, needs resurfacing. This busy section of University Drive connects to the Sawgrass Expressway, (SR 869), creating one of the primary entrances into our City. University Drive is also a hurricane evacuation route. The current roadway surface is in bad shape, needing to be milled and resurfaced. The continuing heavy traffic on this main route to the Expressway is causing further deterioration of this road.

The statewide benefit is that this project will improve linkages to State-owned roadways, smoothing traffic flows. The regional benefit is the improvement of multi-modal access to buses, bike lanes, sidewalks and regional access to a designated hurricane evacuation route. This project will serve the 126,000 residents in Coral Springs, the 1.8 million residents of Broward County and the surrounding South Florida region who use this busy thoroughfare.

Project design documents from the engineer will be provided prior to construction; dated color photographs of the site prior to, during, and immediately following completion of the task; as-built certification; signed statement from a Florida Licensed Professional Engineer indicating road work has been completed in accordance with the design and acceptance of the completed project by the grantee
