Florida law vests authority with the Department of Corrections to implement a correctional education program for those inmates who lack "basic and functional literacy skills.? Highest priority is given to "youthful offenders and those inmates nearing release from the correctional system." This proposed work readiness project will align with the findings of the Department's recent review of correctional education and work training programs and will result in a more cost-effective, scalable and sustainable solution for preparing inmates to re-enter the workforce. The project supports the continuum approach to re-entry readiness and shall be implemented in tandem with substance abuse, mental health and other social services to proactively maximize ex-offender opportunity to gain and sustain employment and reduce recidivism risk.

Nationally, adult incarceration costs average \$20,000 and correctional education costs range from \$1,400 to \$1,744 per inmate per year. For inmates who participated in an educational program while incarcerated, employment after release is 13% higher than those who did not participate. According to the U.S. Department of Justice, the national recidivism rate hovers near 50%. The Florida Department of Corrections data is consistent with the national research and validates that education level is a leading predicator of recidivism. With each grade level an inmate achieves, the likelihood of recidivating decreased by 3% or more.
