PACE Center for Girls, which provides girls and young women an opportunity for a better future through education, counseling, training and advocacy, is a proven program that stems the tide of the more than 12,000 girls referred to Florida's juvenile justice system each year through increased gender responsive prevention, early intervention and mental health services. In FY 15 PACE served more than 2,100 Girls at 19 PACE Centers in Alachua, Broward, Clay, Collier, Duval, Escambia, Hillsborough, Lee, Leon, Manatee, Marion, Miami-Dade, Orange, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, St. Lucie and Volusia counties. In FY 2015, the PACE Reach Counseling Program in Broward County served over 160 girls. Of those girls, 94% reduced their risk factors associated with alcohol, tobacco and other drug use and 83.5% did not recidivate while in the program.

PACE will provide at a minimum ninety (90) girls per month ages eleven (11) to seventeen (17) in Broward, Duval and Hillsborough Counties who are delinquent or at risk of delinquency, services through the PACE Reach Program. PACE will provide Case Management and non-clinical/clinical counseling/therapy for girls and the families, based on the individual Psycho-Social Assessment.
