The Fort Pierce Police Department (FPPD) is seeking to use advanced researched-based technology in the Lincoln Park Community. Facing decreased resources and increased needs, the budgeted items will provide officers with a strategic advantage to initiate a tactical and timely response to incidents of crime as reflected in the services to become available:

Community Policing by officers from the community with a vested community interest.

Law Enforcement Surveillance Camera Systems used to ensure safety of officers and citizens, gather intelligence, and conduct tactical field operations.

Licensing Plate Readers will allow officers to pursue action against offenders and provide a database of stored license plates to benefit ongoing investigations.

Traffic Message Boards positioned in high crime areas to assist in reducing non-violent crimes.

Forward Looking Infrared Systems will be used by officers to see suspects in mild to total darkness without revealing their location.

Mobile Security Towers strategically positioning in higher crime areas, will offer a vantage point in surveillance.

The outcomes of this project will serve as a model locally, regionally, and statewide.
