The USF Morsani College of Medicine and Heart Institute facility will be a 319,176 square foot facility to be constructed on a donated parcel of land in downtown Tampa at the corner of Channelside Drive and Meridian Avenue. In addition to various other ROIs, the downtown location of the Morsani College of Medicine will: 1) enhance student training and education due to proximity to TGH/CAMLS; 2) educate approximately 700 MD students and 100 PA students each year; 3) produce approximately 170 MD degrees and 50 PA degrees each year; 4) increase the number of USF STEM graduate degrees awarded and postdoctoral appointees; and 5) provide access to services and programs on par with the leading medical schools in the country. The downtown location of the USF Health Heart Institute portion of the facility is projected to drive up to \$73 million annually in local economic activity. The downtown strategy will increase NIH grant funding and will position MCOM to move from a current ranking of 63rd to a top-quartile medical school. Florida is a net exporter of medical graduates, but if we can retain them for both medical school and residency, there is a 65% chance of retention which will help to meet workforce needs. USF already leads the SUS in the number of medical school graduates who remain in Florida for residencies.
