The FL Legislature (HB 7069) named the Lastinger Center to (1) develop a statewide literacy professional development system to serve teachers, coaches, and administrators in 100% of Florida school districts and (2) lead the Committee for Early Grade Success. The state sees the Lastinger Center as an expert organization who aligns its work with education policy and has the capacity to develop high-impact, scalable, and sustainable systems that improve teacher practice and student achievement.

The Lastinger Center?s literacy professional development system will reach 30,000 prek-12 teachers and an estimated 1,000,000 students in 100% of Florida districts and charter schools to increase their skills in implementing effective literacy strategies within their classrooms. The Committee on Early Grade Success will develop a system that will improve the knowledge and skills of 50,000 early childhhod educators to serve 500k young children as they enter kindergarten.
