Many families that the CACs serve do not wish to be identified but the CACs have community support from law enforcement, the State Attorney's Office, Department of Children and Families (DCF), therapists and other allied professionals that work in the field of helping and protecting children. Memorandum's of Understanding (MOU's) are in place documenting cooperation and support between each of the 27 CAC's and the partner community agencies. The National Center for Child Advocacy Centers has conducted several studies and written papers on the usefulness of Child Advocacy Centers. These studies document how CAC's improve the delivery of services to child victims in a less traumatic and more efficient manner than was the practice before CAC's were established. Having all the services needed to help these children and their families in one centralized location at the CAC greatly reduces re-victimizing these individuals.

The Children's Advocacy Centers in Florida coordinate and facilitate the Multidisciplinary Teams in their communities which ensures services are provided to these children who are victims of physical and sexual abuse, trafficking, witness to crime, are drug endangered and who witness domestic violence. Services include individual, group and family therapy, medical assessments, psychological evaluations, forensic and specialized interviews, advocacy and referrals to community services.

Services provided to child victims and their non offending caretaker include: individual, group and family therapy, medical assessments, psychological evaluations, forensic and specialized interviews, advocacy and referrals to community services. These services not only assist victims and their families directly, but support the work of other agencies including law enforcement, prosecution and other community agencies to serve these victims.
