



Trends in Class Size Reduction 2002-2003 to 2007-2008




Percent of Schools Over Class Size Cap

Traditional Schools




Percent of Schools Over Class Size Cap

Charter Schools




Percent of Classrooms Over Class Size Cap




Percent of Classrooms Over Class Size Cap

School-Level Compliance Prior to Appeals 2007-2008

- 69 Traditional (2.25%) and 19 Charter have met compliance with class size requirements. (5.38%) Schools were determined to not
- 31 districts had at least 1 school out of compliance

Bases for Appeals

- Unexpected student growth
- Inability to hire teachers
- District reporting errors

Finalizing Appeals, 2007-08

- Action to be taken by State Board of Education
- □ Approval of alternative transfer calculation for noncompliance with class size reduction requirements
- Determination of ineligibility of noncompliant schools from Program participation in the school-year Voluntary Prekindergarten
- Potential action by Commissioner to reduce transfer amount by 10% for 2007-08.
- Action by the Legislative Budget Commission
- Consideration of alternative transfer calculation for noncompliance with class size reduction requirements
