86 590.33 State compact administrator; compact advisory
87 committee.—In pursuance of art. III of the compact, the director
88 of the division shall act as compact administrator for Florida
89 of the Southeastern Interstate Forest Fire Protection Compact
90 during his or her term of office as director, and his or her
91 successor as compact administrator shall be his or her successor
92 as director of the division. As compact administrator he or she
93 shall be an ex officio member of the advisory committee of the
94 Southeastern Interstate Forest Fire Protection Compact, and
95 chair ex officio of the Florida members of the advisory
96 committee. There shall be four members of the Southeastern
97 Interstate Forest Fire Protection Compact Advisory Committee
98 from Florida. Two of the members from Florida shall be members
99 of the Legislature of Florida, one from the Senate and one from
100 the House of Representatives, ~~designated by the Florida~~
101 ~~Commission on Interstate Cooperation,~~ and the terms of any such
102 members shall terminate at the time they cease to hold
103 legislative office, and their successors as members shall be
104 named in like manner. The Governor shall appoint the other two
105 members from Florida, one of whom shall be associated with
106 forestry or forest products industries. The terms of such
107 members shall be 3 years and such members shall hold office
108 until their respective successors shall be appointed and
109 qualified. Vacancies occurring in the office of such members
110 from any reason or cause shall be filled by appointment by the
111 Governor for the unexpired term. The director of the division as

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112 compact administrator for Florida may delegate, from time to
113 time, to any deputy or other subordinate in his or her
114 department or office, the power to be present and participate,
115 including voting as his or her representative or substitute at
116 any meeting of or hearing by or other proceeding of the compact
117 administrators or of the advisory committee. The terms of each
118 of the initial four memberships, whether appointed at said time
119 or not, shall begin upon the date upon which the compact shall
120 become effective in accordance with art. II of said compact. Any
121 member of the advisory committee may be removed from office by
122 the Governor upon charges and after a hearing.

123 Section 27. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
124 law.
