Council/Committee hearing bill: PreK-12 Policy Committee Representative McBurney offered the following:

Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 21-22, insert:

Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 1003.41, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

8 (1) Public K-12 educational instruction in Florida is 9 based on the "Sunshine State Standards." The State Board of 10 Education shall review the Sunshine State Standards and replace 11 them with the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards that 12 establish the core content of the curricula to be taught in this 13 state and that specify the core content knowledge and skills 14 that K-12 public school students are expected to acquire. The 15 Next Generation Sunshine State Standards must, at a minimum: 16 Establish the core curricular content for language arts, (a) 17 science, mathematics, and social studies, as follows:

curricular content for, at a minimum, the reading process,

20 literary analysis, the writing process, writing applications, 21 communication, and information and media literacy. The standards 22 must include distinct grade level expectations for the core 23 content knowledge and skills that a student is expected to have 24 acquired by each individual grade level from kindergarten 25 through grade 8. The language arts standards for grades 9 26 through 12 may be organized by grade clusters of more than one 27 grade level. The language arts standards must also identify 28 significant literary genres and authors that encompass a 29 comprehensive range of historical periods. Beginning with the 30 2011-2012 school year, the reading content shall include civics education materials for all grade levels. The State Board of 31 32 Education shall, in accordance with the expedited schedule 33 established under subsection (2), review and replace the 34 language arts standards adopted by the state board in 2007 with Next Generation Sunshine State Standards that comply with this 35 36 subparagraph.
