 29 for the first time in the 2009-2010 academic year and
 30 thereafter.

31 (3) Except as otherwise provided by law, and for purposes
 32 of this section, the following hours shall be included when
 33 calculating the number of hours taken by a student:

34 (a) All credit hours for courses taken at the state
 35 university from which the student is seeking a baccalaureate
 36 degree, including failed courses; courses that are dropped after
 37 the university's advertised last day of the drop and add period;
 38 courses from which a student withdraws, except as provided for
 39 in subsection (4); and repeated courses, except repeat courses
 40 for which the student has paid the full cost of instruction as
 41 provided in s. 1009.285.

42 (b) All credit hours earned at another institution and
 43 accepted for transfer by the state university toward the
 44 student's baccalaureate degree program.

45 (4) For purposes of this section, credit hours earned
 46 under the following circumstances are not calculated as hours
 47 required to earn a baccalaureate degree:

48 (a) College credits earned through an articulated
 49 accelerated mechanism identified in s. 1007.27.

50 (b) Credit hours earned through internship programs.

51 (c) Credit hours required for certification,
 52 recertification, or certificate programs.

53 (d) Credit hours in courses from which a student must
 54 withdraw due to reasons of medical or personal hardship.

55 (e) Credit hours taken by active-duty military personnel.

56 (f) Credit hours required to achieve a dual major
 57 undertaken while pursuing a baccalaureate degree.

58 (g) Remedial and English as a Second Language credit
 59 hours.

60 (h) Credit hours earned in military science courses
 61 (R.O.T.C.).

62 (5) Each state university and community college shall
 63 implement a process for notifying students regarding the
 64 provisions of this section. The notice must be provided upon the
 65 student's initial enrollment in the institution and again upon
 66 the student's having earned the credit hours required to
 67 complete the baccalaureate degree program in which the student
 68 is enrolled. The notice must include a recommendation that each
 69 student who intends to earn credit hours at the institution
 70 beyond the credit hours required for the baccalaureate degree
 71 program in which the student is enrolled meet with his or her
 72 academic advisor.

73 (6) For purposes of this section, the term "state
 74 university" includes the institutions indentified in s.
 75 1000.21(6) and the term "community college" includes the
 76 institutions identified in s. 1000.21(3).

77 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
