of the company's new Space Coast Next Generation Solar Energy Center at Kennedy Space Center the state needs more such emissions-free power plants.

MERRITT ISLAND — The solar energy center at the Kennedy Space Center could -- and should -- be one of many throughout Florida, Florida Power & Light President and Chief Executive Officer Armando Olivera said Thursday.

But building them costs money, and ratepayers and state taxpayers will have to help finance them.

"We need legislation that would allow utilities to recover the costs for investments in solar power," Olivera said. "It costs inilions of dollars to build these facilities and we need some assurance that our investors would get paid for them. And frankly we can't move forward without those kinds of guarantees."

Olivera's challenge came as FPL commissioned its Space Coast Next Generation Solar Energy Center on NASA property at Kennedy Space Center.

The new solar center is producing an estimated 10 megawatts of emissions-free power. FPL said the energy produced from the 35,000 solar panels is enough to serve about 1,100 homes.

Under sunny skies Thursday morning, about 75 people gathered at the 60-acre, \$70 million solar center to commission the solar facility. The center features solar photovoltaic panels from SunPower Corp., a California manufacturer of solar cells, panels and systems.

The Space Coast Next Generation Solar Energy Center is expected to reduce carbon dioxide emissions by more than 227,000 tons over the life of the project, which according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is equivalent to removing 1,800 cars from the road each year.

It will also save about 122,000 barrels of oil and 2.8 billion cubic feet of natural gas over its lifetime, FPL estimated.

FPL, which posted a net income of \$831 million last year, up more than 5 percent from 2008, said the its solar energy center here and a \$150 million facility in Arcadia in DeSoto County are ready to expansion when the state regulatory environment is more conducive.

In January, the Florida Public Service Commission, with the backing of Gov. Charlie Crist, denied FPL's request for a 6 percent, \$1.3-billion-a-year rate increase. Instead the PSC approved a \$75.5 million base-rate increase for the state's largest utility.

Immediately after that decision, parent company FPL Group announced it would suspend about \$10 billion in capital projects over the next five years.

Eric Draper, executive director of Audubon of Florida who spoke at Thursday's event, urged FPL to keep at it. State lawmakers, Draper said, need to establish policies that encourage projects like the FPL solar facilities." We need a lot more of this," Draper said. "I'm going right back to Tallahassee to push on it. This is a terrific start. We just need to keep going and going."

Ed Smeloff, senior manager of utility project sales at SunPower, said the industry also needs more innovation to keep pressure on costs. "We need to improve the way we manage these facilities," Smeloff said. "We need to drive down costs to make solar a reality for future generations."
