Remove lines 1970-1989 and insert:

the tenant discontinues tenancy in the home. The association shall mail written notice to the parcel owner of the association's demand that the tenant pay regular assessments to the association. The tenant shall not be liable for increases in the amount of the regular assessment due unless the tenant was reasonably notified of the increase prior to the day that the rent is due. The tenant shall be given a credit against rents due to the parcel owner in the amount of assessments paid to the association. The association shall, upon request, provide the tenant with written receipts for payments made. The association may issue notices under s. 83.56 and may sue for eviction under ss. 83.59-83.625 as if the association were a landlord under part II of chapter 83 should the tenant fail to pay an

Amendment No. 2 assessment. However, the association shall not otherwise be considered a landlord under chapter 83 and shall specifically not have any duty under s. 83.51. The tenant shall not, by virtue of payment of assessments, have any of the rights of a parcel owner to vote in any election or to examine the books and records of the association. A court may supersede the effect of this subsection by appointing a receiver. Payments made pursuant to this subsection by a tenant of assessments in lieu of or as a credit against rent shall not be considered a breach of any lease between the tenant and the parcel owner nor serve as cause for eviction or other action for failure to pay rent. Under no circumstances shall the amount of assessments for which a tenant is held responsible under this subsection exceed the amount owed in rent to the parcel owner.

Between lines 47-48, insert:

Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 77.041, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

77.041 Notice to individual defendant for claim of exemption from garnishment; procedure for hearing.—

(1) Upon application for a writ of garnishment by a plaintiff, if the defendant is an individual, the clerk of the court shall attach to the writ the following "Notice to Defendant":

NOTICE TO DEFENDANT OF RIGHT AGAINST

GARNISHMENT OF WAGES, MONEY,

AND OTHER PROPERTY

Page 1 of 5

Amendment No. 1

 The Writ of Garnishment delivered to you with this Notice means that wages, money, and other property belonging to you have been garnished to pay a court judgment against you.

HOWEVER, YOU MAY BE ABLE TO KEEP OR RECOVER YOUR WAGES, MONEY, OR PROPERTY. READ THIS NOTICE CAREFULLY.

State and federal laws provide that certain wages, money, and property, even if deposited in a bank, savings and loan, or credit union, may not be taken to pay certain types of court judgments. Such wages, money, and property are exempt from garnishment. The major exemptions are listed below on the form for Claim of Exemption and Request for Hearing. This list does not include all possible exemptions. You should consult a lawyer for specific advice.

TO KEEP YOUR WAGES, MONEY, AND OTHER PROPERTY FROM BEING GARNISHED, OR TO GET BACK ANYTHING ALREADY TAKEN, YOU MUST COMPLETE A FORM FOR CLAIM OF EXEMPTION AND REQUEST FOR HEARING AS SET FORTH BELOW AND HAVE THE FORM NOTARIZED. YOU MUST FILE THE FORM WITH THE CLERK'S OFFICE WITHIN 20 DAYS AFTER THE DATE YOU RECEIVE THIS NOTICE OR YOU MAY LOSE IMPORTANT RIGHTS. YOU MUST ALSO MAIL OR DELIVER A COPY OF THIS FORM TO THE PLAINTIFF AND THE GARNISHEE AT THE ADDRESSES LISTED ON THE WRIT OF GARNISHMENT.

If you request a hearing, it will be held as soon as possible after your request is received by the court. The plaintiff must file any objection within 3 business days if you hand delivered to the plaintiff a copy of the form for Claim of Exemption and Request for Hearing or, alternatively, 8 business days if you mailed a copy of the form for claim and request to

If the plaintiff files an objection to your Claim 47 of Exemption and Request for Hearing, the clerk will notify you 48 and the other parties of the time and date of the hearing. You 49 may attend the hearing with or without an attorney. If the 50 plaintiff fails to file an objection, no hearing is required, 51 the writ of garnishment will be dissolved and your wages, money, 52 or property will be released. 53 YOU SHOULD FILE THE FORM FOR CLAIM OF EXEMPTION IMMEDIATELY TO 54 KEEP YOUR WAGES, MONEY, OR PROPERTY FROM BEING APPLIED TO THE 55 COURT JUDGMENT. THE CLERK CANNOT GIVE YOU LEGAL ADVICE. IF YOU 56 NEED LEGAL ASSISTANCE YOU SHOULD SEE A LAWYER. IF YOU CANNOT 57 AFFORD A PRIVATE LAWYER, LEGAL SERVICES MAY BE AVAILABLE.
