



### **Environmental Policy Unit Totals**

- Base Budget
  - 9,010 positions
  - \$1.5 billion (all funds)
- New Issues
  - \$656.5 million (all funds)
- Reductions
  - 351 positions
  - \$28.3 million (all funds)





### **Agriculture & Consumer Services**

### \$1.4 Billion

- \$1 Billion Federal Funds
  - \$950 million for School Food and Nutrition Transfer (Federal Portion)
  - \$125.6 million for Additional Authority for National School Lunch Program
  - **\$5.6 million** for Citrus Health Response Plan (Federal Portion)
  - \$1.3 million for Oyster Reseeding and Rehabilitation
  - \$1 million for Reappropriation of ARRA Funds
  - \$850,000 for U.S. Department of Energy Projects
- \$4.7 million Authority to Spend Funds Provided by BP
- \$3.8 million Wildfire Equipment Replacement
- \$1.1 million Agricultural Best Management Practices
- \$400,000 Water Conservation Program Mobile Irrigation Labs



### **Agriculture & Consumer Services**

\$1.4 Billion

- **\$8.5 million** by eliminating 199.5 positions vacant over 120 days
- \$1 million by reducing Precision Agriculture Daily Logistics Online Calendar (PADLOC) Authority
- \$800,000 and 15 positions by consolidating the Division of Standards with Consumer Services



### **Environmental Protection**

### \$1.3 Billion

- \$207.8 million for Water Resource and Restoration Programs
  - \$131.8 million for Clean Water State Revolving Fund
  - \$68.1 million for Drinking Water State Revolving Fund
  - \$7.9 million for Total Maximum Daily Loads
- \$128 million Petroleum Tank Cleanup Projects
- \$40 million Everglades Restoration
- \$22.5 million Land Acquisition
- \$13 million State Park Repairs and Enhancements
- \$10 million Beach Restoration Projects



### **Environmental Protection**

\$1.3 Billion

- \$3.1 million by eliminating 64 positions vacant over 120 days
- \$2.5 million by reducing the Storage Tank Compliance Program
- \$1.2 million by eliminating the transfer to Florida Communities Trust, which is now part of the department



### Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission

\$279.5 million

- \$6.2 million Federal Boating Safety and Improvement Grants
- \$1.8 million Florida Boating Improvement Program
- \$800,000 Artificial Reef Construction
- \$515,000 Wildlife Management Area Land Improvements



### **Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission**

\$279.5 million

- \$1.5 million by reducing 27 vacant law enforcement positions
- \$748,613 and 12 positions by reducing the Keys Sanctuary Federal Contract
- \$325,892 by eliminating 8.5 vacant positions vacant over 120 days



### **Department of Citrus**

\$60.9 million

- \$5 million by realigning budget authority with available revenues
- \$327,933 by eliminating 6 positions vacant over 120 days
