11 (b) Crash reports held by an agency under paragraph (a)
 12 may be made immediately available to the parties involved in the
 13 crash, their legal representatives, their licensed insurance
 14 agents, their insurers or insurers to which they have applied
 15 for coverage, persons under contract with such insurers to
 16 provide claims or underwriting information, prosecutorial
 17 authorities, law enforcement agencies, Florida Department of
 18 Transportation, county traffic operations, victim services
 19 programs, radio and television stations licensed by the Federal
 20 Communications Commission, newspapers qualified to publish legal

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21 notices under ss. 50.011 and 50.031, and free newspapers of
22 general circulation, published once a week or more often,
23 available and of interest to the public generally for the
24 dissemination of news. For the purposes of this section, the
25 following products or publications are not newspapers as
26 referred to in this section: those intended primarily for
27 members of a particular profession or occupational group; those
28 with the primary purpose of distributing advertising; and those
29 with the primary purpose of publishing names and other personal
30 identifying information concerning parties to motor vehicle
31 crashes.
