House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and all tax provisions contained therein.

WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, enacted in 2010, imposed twenty-one taxes on individuals, families, and employers, and

WHEREAS, taxes imposed by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act include the employer mandate and the individual mandate, which are enforced through the federal tax code; the health insurance tax; the "Cadillac plan" excise tax; new health care savings and pharmaceuticals taxes; investment taxes; and the medical device tax, and

WHEREAS, the tax provisions of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act represent a negative impact of hundreds of billions of dollars on the United States economy during the first 10 years after the law was enacted, and

WHEREAS, despite former President Obama's promise to not raise any tax on middle class families, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act includes many tax increases that impact households at all income levels, and

WHEREAS, in 2017, for example, "the reduction in the deductibility of catastrophic losses" provision is projected to

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raise taxes on 13.8 million taxpaying families and individuals, most of whom are middle class, and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of the additional tax burden is borne by consumers in the form of higher health care costs, higher taxes, and decreased value of existing health plans and savings accounts, and

WHEREAS, according to the Joint Committee on Taxation, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act imposed significant and widespread tax increases on taxpayers earning less than \$200,000 a year, despite former President Obama's promises that the law would not do so, and

WHEREAS, millions of Americans have seen their health insurance plans canceled as a result of the onerous regulations and mandates imposed by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, and

WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act has resulted in massive insurance premium increases, which adversely impact household budgets and burdens both families and businesses with enormous increases in deductibles, and

WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act has caused a rapid contraction of the health insurance marketplace due to overregulation, thereby reducing competition in the health care industry to the detriment of consumers and eliminating consumer choice in health care coverage, and

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WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act is collapsing, having been supported by the diversion of funds to pay for cost-sharing reductions that the Congress of the United States did not appropriate or the diversion of funds from the reinsurance program to pay for early expenditures under the act, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Legislature of the State of Florida requests the Congress of the United States to permanently and fully repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and all tax increases imposed by the act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.

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
