Remove lines 288-396 and insert:

(6) Hunting dogs are exempt from this section when engaged in any legal hunt or training procedure. Dogs engaged in training or exhibiting in legal sports such as obedience trials, conformation shows, field trials, hunting/retrieving trials, and herding trials are exempt from this section when engaged in any legal procedures. However, such dogs at all other times in all other respects are subject to this and local laws. Dogs that have been classified as dangerous may not be used for hunting purposes.

Section 5. Section 767.125, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

767.125 Statewide Dangerous Dog Registry.-

- (1) The department shall create and maintain a statewide Dangerous Dog Registry that provides the public with a searchable online database of dogs throughout this state which have been declared dangerous by local authorities.
- (2) Each animal control authority shall, at a minimum, report all of the following information regarding a dangerous dog within its jurisdiction to the department for inclusion in the registry:
- (a) A current certificate of rabies vaccination for the dog.
- (b) Evidence of a proper enclosure within which the dangerous dog will be confined and of the posting of the premises with a clearly visible warning sign at all entry points which informs both children and adults of the presence of a dangerous dog on the property.
- (c) Evidence of permanent identification of the dog, such as a tattoo on the inside thigh or an implantation of a microchip.
 - (d) Evidence of the dog having been spayed or neutered.

Section 7. Section 767.135, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

767.135 Attack or bite by unclassified dog that causes death; confiscation; destruction.—If a dog that has not been declared dangerous attacks and causes the death of a human, the dog <u>must shall</u> be immediately confiscated by an animal control authority; placed in quarantine, if necessary, for the proper length of time; impounded; and or held for 10 business days after the owner is given written notification under s. 767.12,

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This 10-day time period shall allow The owner may to request a hearing under s. 767.12 during the 10-day time period. If the owner files a written appeal under s. 767.12 or this section, the dog must be held and may not be destroyed while the appeal is pending. The owner is responsible for payment of all boarding costs and other fees as may be required to humanely and safely keep the animal during any appeal procedure.

Section 8. Subsection (1) of section 767.136, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

767.136 Attack or bite by unclassified dog that causes severe injury or death; penalties.—

(1) If a dog that has not been declared dangerous attacks and causes severe injury to, or the death of, a human, and the owner of the dog had knowledge of the dog's dangerous propensities, yet <u>failed to secure the dog in a proper enclosure pursuant to s. 767.01(2) demonstrated a reckless disregard for such propensities under the circumstances</u>, the owner of the dog commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

The local government review of any proposed change to a previously approved development of regional impact and of any development order required to construct the development set forth in the development of regional impact must be reviewed by the local government based on the standards in the local comprehensive plan at the time the development was originally approved, and if the development would have been

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consistent with the comprehensive plan in effect when the development was originally approved, the local government may approve the change. If the revised development is approved, the developer may proceed as provided in s. 163.3167(5). For any proposed change to a previously approved development of regional impact, at least one public hearing must be held on the application for change, and any change must be approved by the local governing body before it becomes effective. The review must abide by any prior agreements or other actions vesting the laws and policies governing the development. Development within the previously approved development of regional impact may continue, as approved, during the review in portions of the development which are not directly affected by the proposed change.

(b) The local government shall either adopt an amendment to the development order that approves the application, with or without conditions, or deny the application for the proposed change. Any new conditions in the amendment to the development order issued by the local government may address only those impacts directly created by the proposed change, and must be consistent with s. 163.3180(5), the adopted comprehensive plan, and adopted land development regulations. Changes to a phase date, buildout date, expiration date, or termination date may also extend any required mitigation associated with a phased

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construction project so that mitigation takes place in the same timeframe relative to the impacts as approved.

- (c) This section is not intended to alter or otherwise limit the extension, previously granted by statute, of a commencement, buildout, phase, termination, or expiration date in any development order for an approved development of regional impact and any corresponding modification of a related permit or agreement. Any such extension is not subject to review or modification in any future amendment to a development order pursuant to the adopted local comprehensive plan and adopted local land development regulations.
- development of regional impact showing a dedicated multimodal pathway suitable for bicycles, pedestrians, and low-speed vehicles, as defined in s. 320.01, along any internal roadway must be approved so long as the right-of-way remains sufficient for the ultimate number of lanes of the internal road. Any proposed change to a previously approved development of regional impact which proposes to substitute a multimodal pathway suitable for bicycles, pedestrians, and low-speed vehicles, as defined in s. 320.01, in lieu of an internal road must be approved if the change does not result in any road within or adjacent to the development of regional impact falling below the local government's adopted level of service and does not increase the original distribution of trips on any road analyzed

If a developer has, by his or her actions in reliance on prior regulations, obtained vested or other legal rights that in law would have prevented a local government from changing those regulations in a way adverse to the developer's interests, nothing in this chapter authorizes any governmental agency to abridge those rights. - (12) "Density" means an objective measurement of the number of people or residential units allowed per unit of land, such as <u>dwelling units</u> residents or employees per acre.

(52)(51) "Urban service area" means areas identified in the comprehensive plan where public facilities and services, including, but not limited to, central water and sewer capacity and roads, are already in place or may be expanded through investment by the or are identified in the capital improvements element. The term includes any areas identified in the comprehensive plan as urban service areas, regardless of local government or the private sector as evidenced by an executed agreement with the local government to provide urban services within the local government's 20-year planning period limitation.

(53) (52) "Urban sprawl" means an unplanned or uncontrolled a development pattern characterized by low density, automobile dependent development with either a single use or multiple uses that are not functionally related, requiring the extension of public facilities and services in an inefficient manner, and failing to provide a clear separation between urban and rural uses.

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Section 3. Paragraph (f) of subsection (1), subsection (2), and paragraph (a) of subsection (6) of section 163.3177, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

163.3177 Required and optional elements of comprehensive plan; studies and surveys.—

The comprehensive plan shall provide the principles, guidelines, standards, and strategies for the orderly and balanced future economic, social, physical, environmental, and fiscal development of the area that reflects community commitments to implement the plan and its elements. These principles and strategies shall guide future decisions in a consistent manner and shall contain programs and activities to ensure comprehensive plans are implemented. The sections of the comprehensive plan containing the principles and strategies, generally provided as goals, objectives, and policies, shall describe how the local government's programs, activities, and land development regulations will be initiated, modified, or continued to implement the comprehensive plan in a consistent manner. It is not the intent of this part to require the inclusion of implementing regulations in the comprehensive plan but rather to require identification of those programs, activities, and land development regulations that will be part of the strategy for implementing the comprehensive plan and the principles that describe how the programs, activities, and land development regulations will be carried out. The plan shall

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establish meaningful and predictable standards for the use and development of land and provide meaningful guidelines for the content of more detailed land development and use regulations.

- (f) All required mandatory and optional elements of the comprehensive plan and plan amendments <u>must shall</u> be based upon relevant and appropriate data and an analysis by the local government that may include, but not be limited to, surveys, studies, community goals and vision, and other data available at the time of adoption of the comprehensive plan or plan amendment. To be based on data means to react to it in an appropriate way and to the extent necessary indicated by the data available on that particular subject at the time of adoption of the plan or plan amendment at issue.
- 1. Surveys, studies, and data utilized in the preparation of the comprehensive plan may not be deemed a part of the comprehensive plan unless adopted as a part of it. Copies of such studies, surveys, data, and supporting documents for proposed plans and plan amendments <u>must shall</u> be made available for public inspection, and copies of such plans <u>must shall</u> be made available to the public upon payment of reasonable charges for reproduction. Support data or summaries <u>shall</u> be are not subject to the compliance review process., but The comprehensive plan, the support data, and the summaries must be clearly based on <u>current appropriate</u> data <u>and analysis</u>, which is relevant to and correlates with the proposed amendment. Support data or

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summaries may be used to aid in the determination of compliance and consistency.

- 2. Data must be taken from professionally accepted sources. The application of a methodology utilized in data collection or whether a particular methodology is professionally accepted may be evaluated. However, the evaluation may not include whether one accepted methodology is better than another. Original data collection by local governments is not required. However, local governments may use original data so long as methodologies are professionally accepted.
- 3. The comprehensive plan <u>must shall</u> be based upon permanent and seasonal population estimates and projections, which <u>must shall</u> either be those published by the Office of Economic and Demographic Research or generated by the local government based upon a professionally acceptable methodology, whichever is greater. The plan must be based on at least the minimum amount of land required to accommodate the medium projections as published by the Office of Economic and Demographic Research for at least a 10-year planning period unless otherwise limited under s. 380.05, including related rules of the Administration Commission. Absent physical limitations on population growth, population projections for each municipality, and the unincorporated area within a county must, at a minimum, be reflective of each area's proportional share of the total county population and the total county

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local government as a public emergency shelter or a staging area for emergency response equipment during an emergency officially declared by the state or by the local government under s. 252.38. Such improvements are limited to those necessary to comply with current standards for public emergency evacuation shelters. The owner must enter into a written contract with the local government providing the improvement funding to make the private facility available to the public for purposes of emergency shelter at no cost to the local government for a minimum of 10 years after completion of the improvement, with the provision that the obligation will transfer to any subsequent owner until the end of the minimum period.

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6. One member shall be appointed by the municipal
governing bodies of Belleair Shore, Indian Rocks Beach, Indian
Shores, North Redington Beach, Redington Beach, Redington
Shores, Madeira Beach, Treasure Island, and St. Pete Beach on a

- (d) To fix, alter, charge, and establish rates, fares, and other charges for the services and facilities of the Pinellas Suncoast Transit System, which rates, fees, and charges shall be equitable and just and sufficient to meet the operating requirements of the system along with other revenue that may be available.
- (e) To regulate other operators of public transit in the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Area as to franchises, permits, fares,

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and other charges to	establish rules	and	regulations pertaining

- (e) (f) To make contracts of every name and nature and to execute all instruments necessary or convenient for the carrying on of its business.
- <u>(f)(g)</u> To enter into management contracts with any person or persons for the management of a transit system owned or controlled by the authority for such period or periods of time, and under such compensation and other terms and conditions as shall be deemed advisable by the authority.
- (g)(h) Without limitation, to borrow money and accept gifts or grants or loans of money or other property and to enter into contracts, leases, or other transactions with any federal agency, the state, any agency of the state, the County of Pinellas, or with any other public body of the state.
- (h)(i) To do all acts and things necessary or convenient for the conduct of its business and the general welfare of the authority in order to carry out the powers granted to it by this part or any other law.
