Also requires each school district's digital classrooms plan to give preference to funding technology purchases that will address identified gaps.	Modified position:  1) Require DOE to contract with third party entity to complete an assessment related to the digital-readiness of each school district. 2) Assessment must identify any gaps between a school district's current level of technology and the technology requirements established by DOE.  3)Requires all school districts to participate with results of assessment submitted to Legislature and EOG by 2/1/16.  4) Requires each school district's digital classrooms plan to give preference to funding technology purchases that address any identified gaps.
