

## CHAMBER ACTION

Senate House Comm: WD 2/20/2008

The Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Wise) recommended the following amendment:

## Senate Amendment (with directory and title amendments)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. This act may be cited as "Erin's Law."

Section 2. Paragraph (e) is added to subsection (3) of section 1006.15, Florida Statutes, to read:

1006.15 Student standards for participation in interscholastic extracurricular student activities; regulation. --

(3)

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(e) A private school student is eligible to participate in interscholastic sports at the public school to which the student

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would be assigned according to the district school board's attendance area policies or at a public school that the student could choose to attend under district or interdistrict controlled open enrollment provisions if all of the following conditions are met:

- 1. The private school student meets the requirements of the private school program pursuant to s. 1002.42.
- 2. The private school in which the student is enrolled does not offer the interscholastic sports in which the student would participate at the public school.
- 3. During the period of participation at the public school, the private school student demonstrates educational progress as required in paragraph (b) in all subjects taken in the private school program as confirmed by a transcript from the private school. If the private school student is unable to maintain academic eligibility for participating in interscholastic sports, the student is ineligible to participate in such activities until he or she successfully completes one grading period in all subjects taken in the private school program.
- 4. The private school student meets the same residency requirements as other students in the school at which he or she participates.
- 5. The private school student meets the same standards of acceptance, behavior, and performance as required of other students participating in interscholastic sports at the public school.



6. The private school student registers with the public school his or her intent to participate in interscholastic sports as a representative of the school before the beginning date of the season for the activity in which he or she wishes to participate; however, the private school student must be able to participate in curricular activities if that is a requirement for interscholastic sports. A student who transfers from a private school program to a public school before or during the first grading period of the school year is academically eligible to participate in interscholastic sports during the first grading period if the student meets the requirements of subparagraph 3. from the previous school year.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
