The Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations (Wise) recommended the following:

## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete lines 1097 - 1155 and insert:

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- (e) Provides access to multiple content providers.
- (3) The Department of Education shall provide assistance as requested by school districts in their deployment of a district electronic learning management system.

Section 19. Subsection (4) of section 1006.29, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1006.29 State instructional materials committees.-

(4) For purposes of state adoption, "instructional

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materials" means items having intellectual content that by design serve as a major tool for assisting in the instruction of a subject or course. These items may be available in bound, unbound, kit, or package form and may consist of hardbacked or softbacked textbooks, electronic content, consumables, learning laboratories, manipulatives, electronic media, and computer courseware or software. The term does not include electronic or computer hardware even if such hardware is bundled with software or other electronic media, nor does it include equipment or supplies. A publisher or manufacturer providing instructional materials as a single bundle shall also make the instructional materials available as separate and unbundled items, each priced individually. Any instructional materials adopted after 2012-2013 for students in grades 9 through 12 shall be provided primarily in an electronic format.

Section 20. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 1006.33, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1006.33 Bids or proposals; advertisement and its contents.-(1)

(b) The advertisement shall state that, beginning in 2010-2011, each bidder shall furnish electronic specimen copies of all instructional materials submitted, at a time designated by the department, which specimen copies shall be identical with the copies approved and accepted by the members of the state instructional materials committee, as prescribed in this section, and with the copies furnished to the department and district school superintendents, as provided in this part. Any district school superintendent who requires samples in addition to the electronic format must request those samples through the



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Section 21. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) and subsection (4) of section 1006.40, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

- (3)(a) Each district school board shall use the annual allocation for the purchase of instructional materials included on the state-adopted list, except as otherwise authorized in paragraphs (b) and (c). No less than 50 percent of the annual allocation shall be used to purchase items which will be used to provide instruction to students at the level or levels for which the materials are designed. Beginning with the 2012-2013 fiscal year, not less than 10 percent of the annual allocation shall be used to purchase items for which the major tool of instruction is used electronically.
- (4) The funds described in subsection (3) which district school boards may use to purchase materials not on the stateadopted list shall be used for the purchase of instructional materials or other items having intellectual content which assist in the instruction of a subject or course. These items may be available in bound, unbound, kit, or package form and may consist of hardbacked or softbacked textbooks, electronic content,
