and insert:

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5 the subsequent fiscal year. Each school district shall allocate

6 100 percent of the funds received for international

7 baccalaureate instruction to the school whose students generate

8 such funds and within that school program that generates such

9 <u>funds. Funds allocated in accordance with this paragraph shall</u>

10 be expended solely for the payment of allowable costs associated

11 with the international baccalaureate program and bonuses for

12 teachers who provide international baccalaureate instruction.



13	Such allowable costs are only those associated with
14	international baccalaureate annual school fees, international
15	baccalaureate examination fees, and salaries and benefits for
16	school-based international baccalaureate coordinators;
17	supplemental books, instructional supplies, instructional
18	equipment, or instructional materials for international
19	baccalaureate courses; programs or activities that identify
20	prospective international baccalaureate students or prepare
21	prospective students to enroll in international baccalaureate
22	courses; and training or professional development for
23	international baccalaureate teachers. The bonus for
24	international baccalaureate teachers shall equal the
25	proportionate value of the 0.16 additional funding per eligible
26	student score minus allowable costs, or \$50 per eligible student
27	score, whichever is greater. The teacher bonus in a school
28	designated with a grade of "D" or "F" shall be an additional
29	\$500 if any one of the teacher's international baccalaureate
30	students scores 4 or higher on an international baccalaureate
31	examination. The school district shall distribute to each
32	classroom teacher who provided international baccalaureate
33	instruction:
34	1. A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by
35	the International Baccalaureate teacher in each international
36	baccalaureate course who receives a score of 4 or higher on the
37	international baccalaureate examination.
38	2. An additional bonus of \$500 to each International
39	Baccalaureate teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D"
40	or "F" who has at least one student scoring 4 or higher on the
41	international baccalaureate examination, regardless of the

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42	number of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a
43	4 or higher on the international baccalaureate examination.
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45	Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this paragraph shall
46	not exceed \$2,000, except that the bonuses awarded to a teacher
47	in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" shall not
48	exceed \$5,000, in any given school year and shall be in addition
49	to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is
50	scheduled to receive. If funds received pursuant to this
51	paragraph are not sufficient to fully pay for teacher bonuses
52	after paying mandatory program and examination fees, a school
53	district may prorate all teacher bonuses proportionately to the
54	total funds available.
55	(n) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent
56	membership based on Advanced International Certificate of
57	Education examination scores of studentsA value of 0.16 full-
58	time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each
59	student enrolled in a full-credit Advanced International
60	Certificate of Education course who receives a score of E or
61	higher on a subject examination. A value of 0.08 full-time
62	equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each
63	student enrolled in a half-credit Advanced International
64	Certificate of Education course who receives a score of E or
65	higher on a subject examination. A value of 0.3 full-time
66	equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each
67	student who receives an Advanced International Certificate of
68	Education diploma. Such value shall be added to the total full-
69	time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades
70	9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year. Each school district



71 shall allocate 100 percent of the funds received for Advanced 72 International Certificate of Education instruction to the school 73 whose students generate such funds and within that school 74 program that generates such funds. Funds allocated in accordance 75 with this paragraph shall be expended solely for the payment of 76 allowable costs associated with the Advanced International 77 Certificate of Education program and teacher bonuses. Such 78 allowable costs are only those associated with Advanced 79 International Certificate of Education annual school fees; 80 Advanced International Certificate of Education examination 81 fees; salaries and benefits for school-based Advanced 82 International Certificate of Education coordinators; supplemental books, instructional supplies, instructional 83 84 equipment, or instructional materials for Advanced International 85 Certificate of Education courses; programs or activities that 86 identify prospective Advanced International Certificate of 87 Education students or prepare prospective students to enroll in Advanced International Certificate of Education courses; and 88 89 training or professional development for Advanced International Certificate of Education teachers. The teacher bonus shall equal 90 91 the proportionate value of the 0.16 or 0.08 additional funding 92 per eligible student score minus allowable costs, or \$50 per 93 eligible student score, whichever is greater. The teacher bonus in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" shall be an 94 95 additional \$500 if any one of the teacher's Advanced 96 International Certificate of Education students scores E or 97 higher on an Advanced International Certificate of Education examination. The school district shall distribute to each 98 99 classroom teacher who provided Advanced International

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100	Certificate of Education instruction:
101	1. A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by
102	the Advanced International Certificate of Education teacher in
103	each full-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education
104	course who receives a score of E or higher on the Advanced
105	International Certificate of Education examination. A bonus in
106	the amount of \$25 for each student taught by the Advanced
107	International Certificate of Education teacher in each half-
108	credit Advanced International Certificate of Education course
109	who receives a score of E or higher on the Advanced
110	International Certificate of Education examination.
111	2. An additional bonus of \$500 to each Advanced
112	International Certificate of Education teacher in a school
113	designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one
114	student scoring E or higher on the full-credit Advanced
115	International Certificate of Education examination, regardless
116	of the number of classes taught or of the number of students
117	scoring an E or higher on the full-credit Advanced International
118	Certificate of Education examination.
119	3. Additional bonuses of \$250 each to teachers of half-
120	credit Advanced International Certificate of Education classes
121	in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" which has at
122	least one student scoring an E or higher on the half-credit
123	Advanced International Certificate of Education examination in
124	that class. The maximum additional bonus for a teacher awarded
125	in accordance with this subparagraph shall not exceed \$500 in
126	any given school year. Teachers receiving an award under
127	subparagraph 2. are not eligible for a bonus under this
128	subparagraph.
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Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this paragraph shall 130 131 not exceed \$2,000, except that the bonuses awarded to a teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" shall not 132 133 exceed \$5,000, in any given school year and shall be in addition 134 to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is 135 scheduled to receive. If funds received pursuant to this 136 paragraph are not sufficient to fully pay for teacher bonuses, a 137 school district may prorate all teacher bonuses proportionately 138 to the total funds available.

139 (o) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent 140 membership based on college board advanced placement scores of students.-A value of 0.16 full-time equivalent student 141 142 membership shall be calculated for each student enrolled in each 143 advanced placement course who receives a score of 3 or higher on 144 the College Board Advanced Placement Examination for the prior 145 year and added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the 146 147 subsequent fiscal year. Each school district shall allocate 100 148 percent of the funds received for Advanced Placement instruction 149 to the school that generates such funds. Funds allocated in 150 accordance with this paragraph shall be expended solely for the 151 payment of allowable costs associated with the Advanced 152 Placement Program and teacher bonuses. Such allowable costs are 153 only those associated with Advanced Placement examination fees; 154 salaries and benefits for school-based Advanced Placement 155 coordinators; supplemental books, instructional supplies, 156 instructional equipment, or instructional materials for Advanced 157 Placement courses; programs or activities that identify



158 prospective Advanced Placement students or prepare prospective 159 students to enroll in Advanced Placement courses; and training or professional development for Advanced Placement teachers. The 160 161 teacher bonus shall equal the proportionate value of the 0.16 162 additional funding per eligible student score minus allowable 163 costs, or \$50 per eligible student score, whichever is greater. 164 The teacher bonus in a school designated with a grade of "D" or 165 "F" shall include an additional \$500 per student for the teacher's first four students who score 3 or higher on an 166 167 Advanced Placement examination. Each district must allocate at least 80 percent of the funds provided to the district for 168 169 advanced placement instruction, in accordance with this 170 paragraph, to the high school that generates the funds. The 171 school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who 172 provided advanced placement instruction: 173 1. A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by

174 the Advanced Placement teacher in each advanced placement course 175 who receives a score of 3 or higher on the College Board 176 Advanced Placement Examination.

177 2. An additional bonus of \$500 to each Advanced Placement 178 teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who 179 has at least one student scoring 3 or higher on the College 180 Board Advanced Placement Examination, regardless of the number 181 of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a 3 or 182 higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination. 183

Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this paragraph shall not exceed \$2,000, except that the bonuses awarded to a teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" shall not

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187 <u>exceed \$5,000,</u> in any given school year and shall be in addition 188 to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is 189 scheduled to receive. <u>If funds received pursuant to this</u> 190 <u>paragraph are not sufficient to fully pay for teacher bonuses, a</u> 191 <u>school district may prorate all teacher bonuses proportionately</u> 192 <u>to the total funds available.</u>
