A bill to be entitled

An act relating to resident status for tuition purposes; amending s. 1009.21, F.S.; revising criteria relating to the classification of active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States, and their spouses and dependent children, as residents for tuition purposes; classifying veterans of the Armed Services of the United States, and their spouses and dependent children, as residents for tuition purposes under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (10) of section 1009.21, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1009.21 Determination of resident status for tuition purposes.—Students shall be classified as residents or nonresidents for the purpose of assessing tuition in postsecondary educational programs offered by charter technical career centers or career centers operated by school districts, in Florida College System institutions, and in state universities.

- (10) The following persons shall be classified as residents for tuition purposes:
  - (a) Active duty members of the Armed Services of the

United States residing or stationed in this state, and their spouses, and dependent children, and active drilling members of the Florida National Guard.

- (b) <u>Veterans</u> Active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States, and their spouses and <u>dependent children</u>, who <u>initially apply to an institution of higher education within 4</u> years after the servicemember's honorable discharge from the <u>Armed Services of the United States dependents attending a</u>

  Florida College System institution or state university within 50 miles of the military establishment where they are stationed, if such military establishment is within a county contiguous to Florida.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
