HB 543 2009

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to educational assessment; providing for discontinuation at the end of the 2008-2009 school year of the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test in science administered to students in grade 11; requiring the science assessment administered at the high school level to be one or more end-of-course examinations; specifying requirements for an end-of-course examination; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Notwithstanding s. 1008.22, Florida Statutes, or any other provision of the law to the contrary, the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test in science administered to students in grade 11 shall be discontinued at the end of the 2008-2009 school year. Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, the science assessment administered at the high school level shall be one or more end-of-course examinations. The Commissioner of Education shall select one or more nationally developed comprehensive assessments for use as end-of-course examinations. An end-of-course examination must be rigorous and standardized, approved by the State Board of Education, and administered statewide. The content knowledge and skills assessed by an end-of-course examination must be aligned to the core curricular content established in the Sunshine State Standards.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
