Cconsequently, as with any project that is part of the Annual Capital Improvement Plan, the STEM Center was supported by survey recommendations listed in the Educational Plant Survey, which is submitted to FDOE every five years. The location of the STEM Center is Broward College's North Campus, which currently has a shortage of 292,823 square feet based on projected COFTE for classrooms, vocational labs and non labs.
