Meets needs identified by FL DJJ and Sixth Judicial Circuit (includes Pinellas Co.) for community-based services as alternatives to out-ofhome placements for high risk youth/young people. Per a June 2015 Pinellas County Detention Utilization Study, despite recent progress juvenile arrests increased 4% the preceding FY; between FY2012-2013 and FY2013-2014, there was a 7% increase in detention admissions, and 48% of youth screened went to secure detention as opposed to release, home, or respite.
