Since the advent of Medicaid managed care, it has become even more difficult for rural community transportation coordinators to provide accessible transportation to non-Medicaid transportation disadvantaged citizens. These grant dollars are to be used for innovative projects designed to promote access for persons with disabilities, older adults, and people with low income to health care, employment, education and other life-sustaining activities. A 10% local match is required for the grants.

In Jan. 2014, the Univ. of S. FL Center for Urban Transportation Research published the study "Unmet and Latent Demand for Transportation Disadvantaged Services", prepared for Florida Commission for Transportation Disadvantaged. The study concluded 37% of FL was Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) and within that group there existed a "Critical Need" group of elderly, disabled, and low income citizens, making up 4% of Florida's population. Of this group, 58% of "Critical Need" trips are unmet.
