The purpose is to remove the barrier of overwhelming financial debt that is incurred which prevents students from persisting in college and graduating.

These 100 students will receive monthly transportation and assigned mentors within the College including a mentorship arrangement with an industry partner. Students will be provided with specific financial aid and academic affairs counselors assigned to the Promise
