by the Secretary of State to reflect the rate of inflation or deflation as indicated in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, U.S. City Average, All Items, 1967=100, or successor reports as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor.

(4) As used in this section, the term "expenditure" does not include the payment of compensation for legal and accounting services rendered on behalf of a candidate.

Section 9. Sections 1 through 7 of this act shall take effect on the effective date of House Joint Resolution 81, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose, if that joint resolution is approved by the electors at the general election to be held in November 2010, and section 8 of this act shall take effect January 1, 2010.

graduate teaching assistants. The remaining 30 percent of the revenues from the tuition differential, or an equivalent amount of new revenue from private sources, shall be expended to provide financial aid to undergraduate students who exhibit financial need to meet the cost of university attendance.
