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

# Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 543 Relating to Educational Assessment

The Foundation for Florida's Future advocates voting <u>YES</u> on the <u>Proposed Committee Substitute</u> for HB 543 in the House PreK-12 Committee on March  $10^{\text{th}}$ .

Thanks to bold education reform implemented a decade ago, more Florida students are reading and performing math on grade level than ever before. Recently, *Education Week* ranked Florida's quality of education tenth in the nation in its highly respected annual *Quality Counts* report – up from 14<sup>th</sup> in 2008 and 31<sup>st</sup> in 2007. Florida's rising student achievement and progress in narrowing the achievement gap is evidence that continuing to raise the bar for our children leads to incredible results:



This proposed committee substitute raises the bar by requiring all Florida students to take Biology for high school graduate. Additionally, this bill raises the bar by phasing in a Biology I end-of-course exam that will count toward a student passing the biology course (30 percent of the student's grade). This is the beginning of the Department of Education's gradual move to end-ofcourse exams as assessment testing at the high school level.

Increasing standards will better prepare our children for college and the workforce. Florida's rising student achievement is a result of a system based on high standards and accountability. This proposed committee substitute takes another step to continue our success by raising the expectations for Florida students once more.
