However, no adjustment 28 shall be made for students who enroll in a segmented remedial 29 course delivered online.

72 (VIII) (B) For students enrolled in a school district as a 73 full-time student, the district may report 1/6 FTE for each 74 student who passes a statewide, standardized end-of-course 75 assessment without being enrolled in the corresponding course.
