 Requiring state agencies to recommend reductions in spending each year to eliminate government waste.

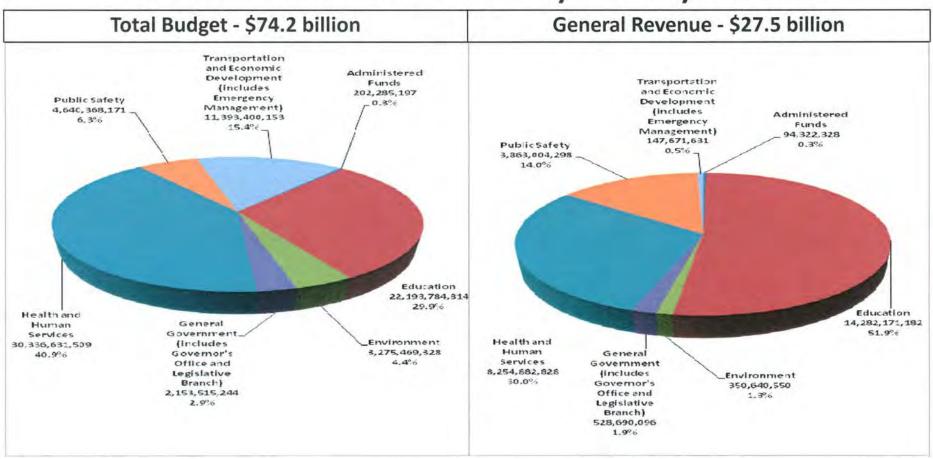

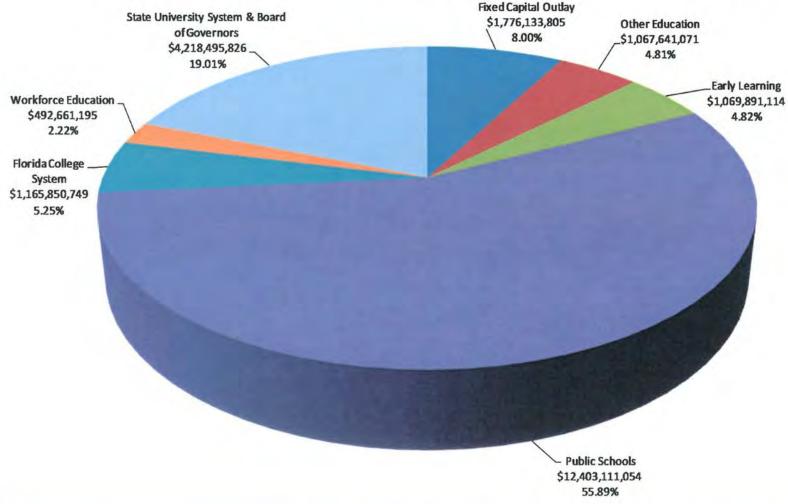
# Governor's Budget Recommendations Fiscal Year 2014-15 by Policy Area

## **Education Highlights**

Major Issues Funded	Amount
Historic Total & State K-12 Public School Funding	\$18.8 billion
Digital Learning	\$40 million
Historic Total & State College Operating Funding	\$2 billion
Historic Total University Operating Funding	\$3.6 billion
Performance Funding for Colleges, Universities and Workforce	\$177.5 million
Fixed Capital Outlay (excluding debt service)	\$408.8 million
School Readiness – Increased One-Time Funding	\$30 million
Voluntary Pre-K – Increased Funding	\$100 per student
Principal and Teacher Training	\$13.4 million

The Governor's budget recommends a zero percent tuition increase for State Universities, State Colleges, and School District Workforce Programs



# EARLY LEARNING



### Early Learning Program Highlights \$59.8 Million Increase

- School Readiness Services \$30 million increase in one-time federal funding to serve an additional 6,500 children
- School Readiness Teacher Improvement \$5 million new onetime federal funds to measure and improve school readiness teacher effectiveness
- Voluntary Prekindergarten Increase per student funding by \$100
- Voluntary Prekindergarten Assessment \$3 million increase to provide a pre- and post-assessment
- Early Childhood Teacher Scholarships \$1.5 million increase to fund additional early childhood teacher scholarships
- Reorganization Efficiencies Reduction of seven vacant positions

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# K-12 Public Schools / FEFP Highlights

- Maintains required local millage tax rate at 5.183
- Salary Increase Continues \$480 million salary increase from current year
- Restores Nonrecurring \$88.4 million
- Workload \$53.9 million new funds to cover 12,529 new students
- Class Size \$15.6 million new funds to cover enrollment growth
- Digital Learning \$40 million new funds to support school districts, \$250,000 minimum per school district
- Summer Algebra Initiative \$8.9 million new funds to provide algebra summer camps to rising 9<sup>th</sup> graders
- Florida Retirement System \$38 million new funds



# K-12 Public Schools Non-FEFP New Issues

- Principal Professional Development \$8.4 million new funds
- Teacher Professional Development \$5 million new funds for implementation of state standards
- School District Matching Grants \$2 million increase for a total of \$6 million
- Florida School for the Deaf and Blind \$1.4 million new funds, for a 2.96% increase, a total of \$49.3 million



# K-12 Public Schools

#### Fixed Capital Outlay

- K-12 Public Schools \$80 million new funds for remodeling, renovation, maintenance, repair, or site improvement
- Charter Schools Continues \$90.6 million for remodeling, renovation, maintenance, repair, or site improvement
- Florida School for the Deaf and Blind \$1.1 million new funds for preventative maintenance projects
- Special Facility Construction Critical Needs \$72.1 million new funds for Glades, Dixie, Washington, Madison, Levy, Calhoun, and Holmes Counties



# Special Facility Construction Projects

- Glades County: Continues funding \$7.9 million for new middle/high school (2<sup>nd</sup> of 3 year funding), 545 student stations
- Dixie County: New Funding of \$12.6 million for a new middle/high school (1<sup>st</sup> of 3 year funding), 1,079 student stations
- Washington County: New funding of \$9.2 million for new Kate Smith Elementary School (1st of 3 years), 993 student stations
- Madison County: New funding of \$8.4 million for major renovations and repairs (1<sup>st</sup> of 2 years)



# Special Facility Construction Projects

continued

- Levy County: New funding of \$11.5 million for new middle/high school (1st of 3 years), 1,125 student stations
- Calhoun County: New funding of \$7.9 million (1st of 3 years) for new Altha K-8 facility, 452 student stations
- Holmes County: New funding of \$14.6 million for new Bonifay elementary/middle facility (1<sup>st</sup> of 3 years), 1,350 student stations



# Workforce Education Highlights

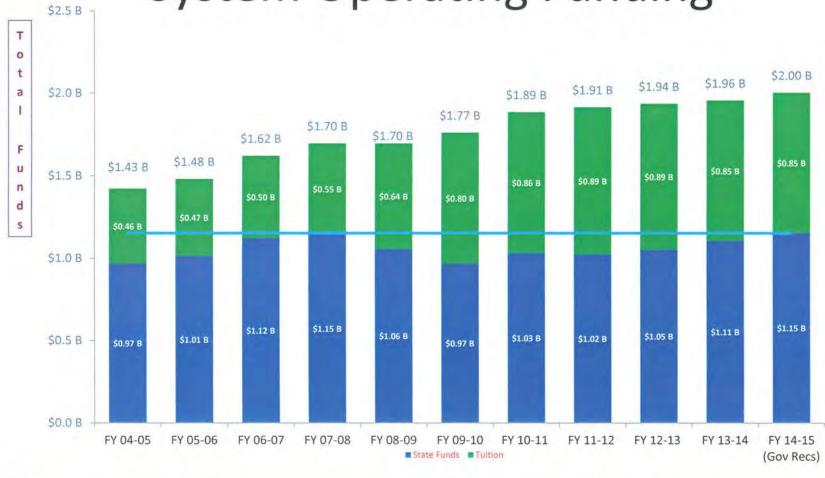
- Performance Funding Provides \$2.5 million new funds for adult general education programs.
- Performance Incentives Continues \$5 million for students earning industry certifications, but expands the program to any certification in high-skill/highwage occupational areas.

# Florida College System Highlights \$50.7 Million Increase

- Performance Funding Provides \$80 million total (\$40 million new funds and \$40 million redirected)
- Performance Incentives— Provides \$10 million (\$5 million new) for students earning industry certifications in high-skill/high-wage occupational areas
- Operating Costs of New Facilities \$736,725 new funds
- Florida Retirement System \$4.1 million new funds



# Florida College System Fixed Capital Outlay

- Facility Maintenance and Repair \$22.8 million new funds
- STEM Facilities \$20 million new funds to expand STEM education through necessary facility renovation or construction. Requires a dollar for dollar match.



# Student Financial Aid Highlights

- Bright Futures Scholarships Fully funds at \$260 million based on latest estimating conference
- Florida Resident Access Grant (FRAG) \$3.8 million new funds to fund all students at \$2,500 at eligible nonprofit education institutions, for a total of \$93.4 million

# State University System Highlights \$121.5 Million Increase

- Performance Funding Provides \$80 million total (\$40 million new funds and \$40 million redirected)
- Medical Schools Final Year \$5.5 million new funds for final year implementation of UCF and FIU medical schools
- Algebra Nation \$2 million new funds, for a total of \$4 million for UF Lastinger Center
- Operating Costs of New Facilities \$6.1 million new funds
- Florida Retirement System \$12.3 million new funds



# State University System Fixed Capital Outlay

- Facility Maintenance and Repair \$34.0 million new funds
- STEM Facilities –\$50 million new funds to expand STEM education through necessary facility renovation or construction. Requires a dollar for dollar match.
- Capital Improvement Fee Projects \$31.1 million budget authority to spend cash balance in trust fund collected from student fees



# OTHER ISSUES



### Vocational Rehabilitation Highlights

- Vocational Rehabilitation Additional Services -\$18.3 million additional General Revenue funds to match federal dollars, estimated to serve 5,000 clients to remove barriers to employment
- Disability Jobs Portal Single Point of Contact -\$272,400 recommended by the Governor's Commission on Jobs for Floridians with Disabilities



### **Public Broadcasting**

- Florida Channel Year Round Coverage \$199,860 new funds to provide for personnel costs related to the expansion to 15 channels / 17 streams
- Florida Channel Capitol Technical Center \$75,000 new funds to cover replacement and upgrading equipment
- Public Broadcasting Maintenance \$2.2 million new funds to repair critical maintenance issues at four public broadcasting stations



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
