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Testimony to House of Representatives Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee – January 13, 2014

BAYADA Home Health Care is the nation's largest privately-held home health care provider, operating in 22 states including eight offices in Central Florida. Since 1975, BAYADA health care professionals have provided cost-effective, high quality care to our clients in the preferred setting — at home.

BAYADA provides care to more than 750 Floridians every day, including the poorest, sickest Floridians who receive state-funded care. Although BAYADA serves Florida Medicaid recipients, BAYADA is not a Medicaid-certified provider through the Agency for Health Care Administration. In fact, of the more than 2,200 licensed home health care agencies in Florida, just over 40, or three percent, are Medicaid-certified due to low reimbursement for traditional Medicaid services. Medicaid rates for home health care services have not increased since 1987, which has resulted in providers being unable to care for this population and still make ends meet, and leaving more than three million Florida Medicaid recipients to receive home and community-based services almost entirely through the state's multiple waiver programs.

Since 1987, the state has paid a registered nurse (RN) \$31.04ⁱ per visit to provide skilled care to a Medicaid patient at home. For a licensed practical nurse (LPN), the state pays \$26.19ⁱⁱ per visit. According to the Home Care Association of Florida 2013 Salary & Benefits Report, the average compensation per-visit for RNs and LPNs is \$37.42 and \$26.70, respectively. Before the clinician enters the home to provide care for a Medicaid recipient, the provider has already lost \$6.38 on an RN visit and 51 cents on an LPN visit.^{III} Beyond this inability for an agency to break even when sending a nurse into a Medicaid recipient's home, providers also have to factor in indirect costs, such as licensing fees, accreditation, orientation, background screening, worker's compensation, unemployment insurance, competency testing, and continuing education. Further, the Affordable Care Act's employer mandate is certain to have a significant financial impact on home health care providers.

In closing, as the state seeks to reduce its Medicaid expenditures while maintaining high quality care for recipients, I urge you to take into consideration the findings of a recent AARP report: the Medicaid program can serve three seniors or adults with physical disabilities at home for the cost of one in a skilled nursing facility.^{IV} In order to ensure that home health care is a viable alternative to institutional care, Medicaid providers must receive adequate reimbursement for services. The State should look to home health care as the answer for controlling costs and maintaining quality care in the patient's preferred setting.
