 - (d) Completed a graduate level course in pharmacology.
- (2) The board may provide by rule additional requirements appropriate for each applicant practicing in a specialty under s. 464.012(4).
- (3) An independent advanced practice registered nurse may perform, without physician supervision or a protocol, the acts authorized in s. 464.012(3), acts within his or her specialty as described in s. 464.012(4), and any of the following:
- (a) For a patient who requires the services of a health care facility, as defined in s. 408.032(8):
 - 1. Admit the patient to the facility.
 - 2. Manage the care the patient receives in the facility.
 - 3. Discharge the patient from the facility.
- (b) Provide a signature, certification, stamp, verification, affidavit, or other endorsement that is otherwise required by law to be provided by a physician.
- (4) An advanced practice registered nurse registered under this section must submit to the department proof of registration along with the certification information required under s.
- 42 456.0391, and the department shall include the registration in

the advanced practice registered nurse's practitioner profile created pursuant to s. 456.041.

- an independent advanced practice registered nurse must complete at least 10 hours of continuing education in pharmacology in addition to completing the continuing education requirements provided for in rule by the Board of Nursing pursuant to s.

 464.013. The biennial renewal for registration shall coincide with the independent advanced practice registered nurse's biennial renewal period for his or her advanced practice registered nurse certification. If, consequently, the initial renewal period occurs prior to January 1, 2015, the independent advanced practice registered nurse is not required to complete the continuing education requirement under this subsection until the following biennial renewal period.
- (6) The board shall register any nurse meeting the qualifications in this section. The board shall establish an application fee not to exceed \$500 and a biennial renewal fee not to exceed \$500. The board is authorized to adopt such other rules as are necessary to implement the provisions of this section, including rules for the discipline of and revocation of the registration of an independent advanced practice registered nurse for violation of any provision of s. 458.331.

Section 103. Section 456.50, Florida Statutes, is amended as follows:

456.50 Repeated medical malpractice.

- (1) For purposes of s. 26, Art. X of the State Constitution and ss. 458.331(1)(t), (4), and (5) and 459.015(1)(x), (4), and (5):
- (a) "Board" means the Board of Medicine, in the case of a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or an independent advanced practice registered nurse registered under s. 458.3155, or the Board of Osteopathic Medicine, in the case of an osteopathic physician licensed pursuant to chapter 459.

- (b) "Final administrative agency decision" means a final order of the licensing board following a hearing as provided in s. 120.57(1) or (2) or s. 120.574 finding that the licensee has violated s. 458.331(1) (t) or s. 459.015(1) (x).
- (c) "Found to have committed" means the malpractice has been found in a final judgment of a court of law, final administrative agency decision, or decision of binding arbitration.
- (d) "Incident" means the wrongful act or occurrence from which the medical malpractice arises, regardless of the number of claimants or findings. For purposes of this section:
- 1. A single act of medical malpractice, regardless of the number of claimants, shall count as only one incident.
- 2. Multiple findings of medical malpractice arising from the same wrongful act or series of wrongful acts associated with the treatment of the same patient shall count as only one incident.
- (e) "Level of care, skill, and treatment recognized in general law related to health care licensure" means the standard of care specified in s. 766.102.
- (f) "Medical doctor" means a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459 or for the purposes of this section only, an independent advanced practice registered nurse registered under s. 458.3155.
- (g) "Medical malpractice" means the failure to practice medicine in accordance with the level of care, skill, and treatment recognized in general law related to health care

licensure. Only for the purpose of finding repeated medical malpractice pursuant to this section, any similar wrongful act, neglect, or default committed in another state or country which, if committed in this state, would have been considered medical malpractice as defined in this paragraph, shall be considered medical malpractice if the standard of care and burden of proof applied in the other state or country equaled or exceeded that used in this state.

- (h) "Repeated medical malpractice" means three or more incidents of medical malpractice found to have been committed by a medical doctor. Only an incident occurring on or after November 2, 2004, shall be considered an incident for purposes of finding repeated medical malpractice under this section.
- (2) For purposes of implementing s. 26, Art. X of the State Constitution, the board shall not license or register or continue to license or register a medical doctor found to have committed repeated medical malpractice, the finding of which was based upon clear and convincing evidence. In order to rely on an incident of medical malpractice to determine whether a license or registration must be denied or revoked under this section, if the facts supporting the finding of the incident of medical malpractice were determined on a standard less stringent than clear and convincing evidence, the board shall review the record of the case and determine whether the finding would be supported under a standard of clear and convincing evidence. Section 456.073 applies. The board may verify on a biennial basis an

out-of-state licensee's <u>or registrant's</u> medical malpractice history using federal, state, or other databases. The board may require licensees <u>or registrants</u> and applicants for licensure <u>or registration</u> to provide a copy of the record of the trial of any medical malpractice judgment, which may be required to be in an electronic format, involving an incident that occurred on or after November 2, 2004. For purposes of implementing s. 26, Art. X of the State Constitution, the 90-day requirement for granting or denying a complete allopathic or osteopathic licensure application in s. 120.60(1) is extended to 180 days.

Section 104. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
