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A bill to be entitled  
 An act relating to the Florida Best and Brightest  
 Teacher Scholarship Program; creating s. 1012.731,  
 F.S.; providing legislative intent; establishing the  
 Florida Best and Brightest Teacher Scholarship  
 Program; providing eligibility criteria; requiring a  
 school district to annually submit the number of  
 eligible teachers to the department; providing for  
 funding and the disbursement of funds; defining the  
 term "school district" for purposes of the act;  
 providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1012.731, Florida Statutes, is created  
 to read:

1012.731 The Florida Best and Brightest Teacher  
 Scholarship Program.—

(1) The Legislature recognizes that, second only to  
 parents, teachers play the most critical role within schools in  
 preparing students to achieve a high level of academic  
 performance. The Legislature further recognizes that research  
 has linked student outcomes to a teacher's own academic  
 achievement. Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature to  
 designate teachers who have achieved high academic standards  
 during their own education as Florida's best and brightest

27 teacher scholars.

28 (2) There is created the Florida Best and Brightest  
29 Teacher Scholarship Program to be administered by the Department  
30 of Education. Beginning in the 2015-2016 school year, the  
31 scholarship program shall provide categorical funding for  
32 scholarships to be awarded to teachers who have demonstrated a  
33 high level of academic achievement.

34 (3) (a) To be eligible for a scholarship, a teacher:

35 1. Must have scored at or above the 80th percentile on  
36 either the SAT or the ACT based upon the percentile ranks in  
37 effect when the teacher took the assessment and have been  
38 evaluated as highly effective pursuant to s. 1012.34; or

39 2. If the teacher is a first-year teacher who has not been  
40 evaluated pursuant to s. 1012.34, must have scored at or above  
41 the 80th percentile on either the SAT or the ACT based upon the  
42 percentile ranks in effect when the teacher took the assessment.

43 (b) In order to demonstrate eligibility for an award, an  
44 eligible teacher must submit to the school district, no later  
45 than October 1, an official record of his or her SAT or ACT  
46 score demonstrating that the teacher scored at or above the 80th  
47 percentile based upon the percentile ranks in effect when the  
48 teacher took the assessment. Once a teacher is deemed eligible  
49 by the school district, the teacher shall remain eligible as  
50 long as he or she is employed by the school district and  
51 maintains or, if the teacher is a first-year teacher, earns the  
52 evaluation designation of highly effective pursuant to s.

53 1012.34.

54 (4) Annually, by December 1, each school district shall  
 55 submit to the department the number of eligible teachers who  
 56 qualify for the scholarship.

57 (5) Annually, by February 1, the department shall disburse  
 58 scholarship funds, in an amount prescribed annually by the  
 59 Legislature in the General Appropriations Act, to each school  
 60 district for each eligible teacher to receive a scholarship. If  
 61 the number of eligible teachers exceeds the total appropriation  
 62 authorized in the General Appropriation Act, the department  
 63 shall prorate the per teacher scholarship amount.

64 (6) Annually, by April 1, each school district shall  
 65 provide payment of the scholarship to each eligible teacher.

66 (7) For purposes of this section, the term "school  
 67 district" includes the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind  
 68 and charter school governing boards.

69 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
