932.703 Forfeiture of contraband article; exceptions.-

(1) (a) A Any contraband article, vessel, motor vehicle, 9 aircraft, other personal property, or real property used in 10 violation of any provision of the Florida Contraband Forfeiture 11 Act, or in, upon, or by means of which any violation of the 12 Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act has taken or is taking place, 13 14 may be seized only upon the arrest of the owner of the property for a violation of a criminal law that renders the property a 15 contraband article, or when the property was used in violation 16 of a criminal law that renders the property a contraband article 17

18	and shall be forfeited subject to the provisions of the Florida

20	1. The owner of the contraband article cannot be

37	probable cause that the property was lawfully seized pursuant to

39	the seizure and the filing deadline shall be calculated in
40	accordance with the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure.
41	1. Upon a written finding of probable cause, the seized
42	property may be held by the seizing agency pending the

Upon a finding that probable cause does not exist, any 45 forfeiture hold, lien, lis pendens, or other civil encumbrance 46 shall be released within 5 days thereafter. 47 3. Upon a finding of good cause, the court shall seal any 48 portion of the petition and the record of any related proceeding 49 that is exempt or confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and 50 s. 24(a) Art. I of the Florida Constitution. 51 (c) (b) Once property is seized pursuant to the Florida 52 Contraband Forfeiture Act, regardless of whether the civil 53 complaint has been filed, all settlements must be personally 54 approved by the head of the law enforcement agency making the 55 seizure. property that is seized or subject to the restraining order. A 69 70 forfeiture under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act is not final, and title or other indicia of ownership, other than 71 provisional title, do not pass to a seizing agency until the 72 title to the seized property is perfected in accordance with the 73 Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act All rights to, interest in, 74 75 and title to contraband articles used in violation of s. 932.702 shall immediately vest in the seizing law enforcement agency 76 77 upon seizure.

78 (e) (d) The seizing agency may not use the seized property 79 for any purpose until the rights to, interest in, and title to 80 the seized property are perfected in accordance with the Florida 81 Contraband Forfeiture Act. This section does not prohibit use or 82 operation necessary for reasonable maintenance of seized 83 property. Reasonable efforts shall be made to maintain seized 84 property in such a manner as to minimize loss of value.

(2) (a) Personal property may be seized at the time of the 85 property owner's arrest, of the violation or subsequent to the 86 arrest, or when seizure of a contraband article is made without 87 88 an arrest pursuant to paragraph (1) (a) violation, if the person 89 entitled to notice is notified at the time of the seizure or by certified mail, return receipt requested, that there is a right 90 to an adversarial preliminary hearing after the seizure to 91 determine whether probable cause exists to believe that such 92 property was lawfully seized pursuant to paragraph (1)(a) - has 93 been or is being used in violation of the Florida Contraband 94

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95 Forfeiture Act. Seizing agencies shall make a diligent effort to notify the person entitled to notice of the seizure. Notice 96 provided by certified mail must be mailed within 5 working days 97 after the seizure and must state that a person entitled to 98 99 notice may request an adversarial preliminary hearing within 15 days after receiving such notice. When a postseizure, 100 adversarial preliminary hearing as provided in this section is 101 102 desired, a request must be made in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the seizing agency. The seizing 103 agency shall set and notice the hearing, which must be held 104 105 within 10 days after the request is received or as soon as practicable thereafter. 106

(b) Real property may only not be seized or restrained 107 pursuant to paragraph (1)(a), other than by lis pendens, 108 subsequent to a violation of the Florida Contraband Forfeiture 109 110 Act until the persons entitled to notice are afforded the opportunity to attend the preseizure adversarial preliminary 111 hearing. A lis pendens may be obtained by any method authorized 112 by law. Notice of the adversarial preliminary hearing shall be 113 by certified mail, return receipt requested. The purpose of the 114 adversarial preliminary hearing is to determine whether probable 115 cause exists to believe that such property has been lawfully 116 117 seized pursuant to paragraph (1)(a) used in violation of the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act. The seizing agency shall make 118 a diligent effort to notify any person entitled to notice of the 119 seizure. The preseizure adversarial preliminary hearing provided 120

121 herein shall be held within 10 days <u>after</u> of the filing of the 122 lis pendens or as soon as practicable.

(c) When an adversarial preliminary hearing is held, the 123 court shall review the verified affidavit and any other 124 supporting documents and take any testimony to determine whether 125 there is probable cause to believe that the property was 126 lawfully seized pursuant to paragraph (1)(a) used, is being 127 used, was attempted to be used, or was intended to be used in 128 violation of the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act. If probable 129 cause is established, the court shall authorize the seizure or 130 continued seizure of the subject contraband. A copy of the 131 findings of the court shall be provided to any person entitled 132 to notice. 133

(d)If the court determines that probable cause exists to 134 believe that the property was lawfully seized pursuant to 135 paragraph (1) (a) such property was used in violation of the 136 Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act, the court shall order the 137 property restrained by the least restrictive means to protect 138 against disposal, waste, or continued illegal use of such 139 property pending disposition of the forfeiture proceeding. The 140 court may order the claimant to post a bond or other adequate 141 security equivalent to the value of the property. 142

(6) (a) Property may not be forfeited under the Florida
Contraband Forfeiture Act unless the seizing agency establishes
by a preponderance of the evidence that the owner either knew,
or should have known after a reasonable inquiry, that the

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147 property was being employed or was likely to be employed in 148 criminal activity.

(a) (b) A bona fide lienholder's interest that has been 149 perfected in the manner prescribed by law prior to the seizure 150 may not be forfeited under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act 151 unless the seizing agency establishes by a preponderance of the 152 evidence that the lienholder had actual knowledge, at the time 153 the lien was made, that the property was being employed or was 154 likely to be employed in criminal activity. If a lienholder's 155 interest is not subject to forfeiture under the requirements of 156 this section, such interest shall be preserved by the court by 157 ordering the lienholder's interest to be paid as provided in s. 158 932.7055. 159

(b) (c) Property titled or registered between husband and 160 wife jointly by the use of the conjunctives "and," "and/or," or 161 "or," in the manner prescribed by law prior to the seizure, may 162 not be forfeited under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act 163 unless the seizing agency establishes by clear and convincing 164 evidence a preponderance of the evidence that the coowner either 165 knew or acted with reckless disregard for the fact had reason to 166 know, after reasonable inquiry, that such property was employed 167 or was likely to be employed in criminal activity. 168

(c) (d) A vehicle that is rented or leased from a company engaged in the business of renting or leasing vehicles, which vehicle was rented or leased in the manner prescribed by law prior to the seizure, may not be forfeited under the Florida

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Contraband Forfeiture Act, and no fine, penalty, or 173 174 administrative charge, other than reasonable and customary charges for towing and storage, shall be imposed by any 175 governmental agency on the company which rented or leased the 176 vehicle, unless the seizing agency establishes by preponderance 177 of the evidence that the renter or lessor had actual knowledge, 178 at the time the vehicle was rented or leased, that the vehicle 179 was being employed or was likely to be employed in criminal 180 181 activity. When a vehicle that is rented or leased from a company engaged in the business of renting or leasing vehicles is seized 182 under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act, upon learning the 183 address or phone number of the company, the seizing law 184 enforcement agency shall, as soon as practicable, inform the 185 company that the vehicle has been seized and is available for 186 the company to take possession upon payment of the reasonable 187 and customary charges for towing and storage. 188

Any interest in, title to, or right to property titled 189 (7)or registered jointly by the use of the conjunctives "and," 190 "and/or," or "or" held by a coowner, other than property held 191 jointly between husband and wife, may not be forfeited unless 192 the seizing agency establishes by clear and convincing evidence 193 a preponderance of the evidence that the coowner either knew, or 194 acted with reckless disregard for the fact had reason to know, 195 after reasonable inquiry, that the property was employed or was 196 likely to be employed in criminal activity. When the interests 197 of each culpable coowner are forfeited, any remaining coowners 198

shall be afforded the opportunity to purchase the forfeited 199 interest in, title to, or right to the property from the seizing 200 201 law enforcement agency. If any remaining coowner does not purchase such interest, the seizing agency may hold the property 202 in coownership, sell its interest in the property, liquidate its 203 interest in the property, or dispose of its interest in the 204 property in any other reasonable manner. 205

Section 3. Subsections (8), (9), and (11) of section 206 932.704, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 207

932.704 Forfeiture proceedings.-

(8) (a) Upon clear and convincing evidence that the 209 contraband article was being used in violation of the Florida 210 Contraband Forfeiture Act, The court shall order the seized 211 property forfeited to the seizing law enforcement agency upon 212 213 clear and convincing evidence that:

1. The property has been or is being used in violation of 214 a criminal law that renders the property a contraband article. 215 216

2. The claimant is the owner of the property.

a. Been placed into a pretrial intervention program; 220
