If consent cannot be given by the vulnerable adult, the facility must give 26 27 written notice to the vulnerable adults' next of kin or legal representative, and must show that this action is necessary for 28 29 the immediate health, safety or welfare of the vulnerable adult. 30 Recovery for the facility shall not exceed the value of the debt 31 owed for services provided to the vulnerable adult plus any 32 reasonable attorney fees or costs incurred in bringing the cause of action. Any recovery in excess of this amount owed belongs to 33 34 the vulnerable adult or the vulnerable adult's estate.

35 <u>(3)</u> The action may be brought in any court of competent 36 jurisdiction to enforce such action and to recover actual and 37 punitive damages for any deprivation of or infringement on the 38 rights of a vulnerable adult. A party who prevails in any such 39 action may be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees, 40 costs of the action, and damages.

41 (4) The remedies provided in this section are in addition 42 to and cumulative with other legal and administrative remedies 43 available to a vulnerable adult.
