An act relating to civil remedies for terrorism; creating s. 772.13, F.S.; creating a cause of action relating to terrorism; specifying a measure of damages; prohibiting claims by specified individuals; providing for attorney fees and costs; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 772.13, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

772.13 Civil remedy for terrorism or facilitation or furthering terrorism.—

- (1) Any person who has been injured by an act of terrorism as defined in s. 775.30 or a violation of any law for which the penalty is increased pursuant to s. 775.31 for facilitating or furthering terrorism shall have a cause of action for threefold the actual damages sustained and, in any such action, is entitled to minimum damages in the amount of \$1,000, and reasonable attorney fees and court costs in the trial and appellate courts.
- (2) A person injured by reason of his or her participation in the same act or transaction that resulted in the act of terrorism or resulted in the defendant's penalty increase pursuant to s. 775.31 may not bring a claim under this section.
