A bill to be entitled

An act relating to military and veteran support; amending s. 292.10, F.S.; revising military discharge requirements for veterans authorized to receive assistance from local governing bodies; requiring the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs to include a section on agricultural farming opportunities for veterans, in the Florida Veterans' Benefits Guide; amending s. 455.213, F.S.; requiring the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to waive professional licensing fees for veterans with a general discharge under honorable conditions; requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and the Department of Military Affairs to create a commercial driver license testing pilot program; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 292.10, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

292.10 Local governing bodies authorized to assist war veterans; powers.—The board of county commissioners of each county and the governing body of each city in the state are hereby granted full and complete power and authority to aid and assist wherever practical and feasible the veterans, male and

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female, who have served in the Armed Forces of the United States in any war, or and received an honorable discharge or a general discharge under honorable conditions from any branch of the military service of the United States, and their dependents, in presenting claims for and securing such compensation, hospitalization, education, loans, career training, and other benefits or privileges to which said veterans, or any of them, are or may become entitled under any federal or state law or regulation by reason of their service in the Armed Forces of the United States.

Section 2. <u>Agricultural farming opportunities for</u> veterans.--

- (1) The Department of Veterans' Affairs, through a direct-support organization under s. 292.055, Florida Statutes, and in consultation with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, shall include a section on agricultural farming opportunities in the state, for veterans of the United States Armed Forces, in the Florida Veterans' Benefits Guide. The section must include, at a minimum:
- (a) Information on federal, state and local agricultural farming programs, incentives, assistance, and grants, available to veterans.
- (b) Federal and state agricultural farming outreach and advocacy programs, available to veterans.
 - (2) The Department of Veterans' Affairs must:
 - (a) Make the guides available to all military installations

(b) Provide a consolidated description of and link to the section on its website.

Section 3. Subsection (12) of section 455.213, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

455.213 General licensing provisions.-

(12) The department shall waive the initial licensing fee, the initial application fee, and the initial unlicensed activity fee for a military veteran or his or her spouse at the time of discharge, if he or she applies to the department for a license, in a format prescribed by the department, within 60 months after the veteran is discharged from any branch of the United States Armed Forces. To qualify for this waiver, the veteran must have been honorably discharged or received a general discharge under honorable conditions.

Section 4. Before June 30, 2016, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and the Department of Military Affairs shall jointly create a pilot program with the purpose of providing on-site commercial driver license testing opportunities to qualified members of the Florida National Guard pursuant to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles commercial driver license skills test waiver in s. 322.12. The testing shall be held at a Florida National Guard Armory, Armed Forces Reserve Center, or the Camp Blanding Joint Training Center. The pilot program shall be accomplished using existing funds appropriated to each department.
