

Hip joint replacement

Definition

Hip joint replacement is surgery to replace all or part of the hip joint with a man-made (artificial) joint. The artificial joint is called a prosthesis.

Alternative Names

Hip arthroplasty; Total hip replacement; Hip hemiarthroplasty


Description

Your hip joint is made up of two major parts. One or both parts may be replaced during surgery:

- ▶ The hip socket (a part of the pelvic bone called the acetabulum)
- ▶ The upper end of the thighbone (called the femoral head)

The new hip that replaces the old one is made up of these parts:

- A socket, which is usually made of strong metal
- A liner, which fits inside the socket. It is usually plastic, but some surgeons are now trying other materials, like ceramic and metal. The liner allows the hip to move smoothly.
- A metal or ceramic ball that will replace the round head (top) of your thigh bone.
- A metal stem that is attached to the thigh bone to make the joint more stable.





Medicaid Electronic Health Record Incentive Program

- The Agency administers the Medicaid Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive program
- Provides financial incentives to eligible hospitals and professionals for the adoption and Meaningful Use of EHRs



Florida Medicaid Incentive Program

EHR Incentive Program Meaningful Use of Health IT

- Documentation and management of health information
- Tracking of key clinical conditions
- Communication of health information to providers and patients
- Improved care coordination
- Improved clinical decision support
- Engagement of patients and families as health care consumers
- Reporting of clinical quality measures
- Reporting of public health information




e-Prescribing

- e-Prescribing: the electronic transmission of prescriptions and access to a patient's medication history by prescribing physicians at the point of care
- The Agency produces a quarterly dashboard of metrics
 - Provides statewide adoption and use trending
 - Shows comparison of Florida to national e-prescribing rates

FL-HIE Governance

- The Agency is the governing body of the FL-HIE and vets participants
- Harris Corporation operates the FL-HIE services and the gateway to the eHealth Exchange
- Sustained by user fees





FL-HIE Services

Patient Look Up

- Connects existing health care provider networks to exchange health information across a statewide information highway
- A Hybrid version is available to connect to the network through Direct Messaging.

Direct Messaging Service

- HIPAA-compliant email service allows participants to send and receive messages and attachments containing a patient's clinical data
- Providers do not need to have an active HER program to use this service

Event Notification Service

- Provides alerts to health plans about their members' hospital encounters
- The health plan then notifies the patient's primary care provider for care coordination



FL-HIE Patient Look-Up (PLU) Service

- PLU connects regional HIEs through a federated model
- Provides transport only no centralized database
- Each participating organization:
 - maintains its own records
 - ensures required safeguards are in place
 - is responsible for vetting user access
- Participants can audit to verify that users of the PLU service are in compliance with the consent policy






FL-HIE PLU Participants

- Ten health care provider systems reaching 22% of hospital beds in Florida.
- An additional four health care provider systems are in the process of joining
- Includes hospitals, clinics, and long-term post-acute care providers
- Enables cost effective participation in nationwide eHealth Exchange

FL-HIE Direct Messaging

- A simple standards-based way to send and receive authenticated and encrypted health information over the Internet, regardless of location or HER system in use by exchanging parties
- Direct messaging is now an integral component of Stage 2 Meaningful Use objectives and measures that eligible providers must meet to receive payments
- Certified EHRs support direct exchange



FL-HIE Direct Messaging Service

- Operated by Inpriva under contract with Harris Corporation for the FL-HIE
 - Inpriva is accredited by Direct Trust
- Enables exchange of messages by users of any Direct Trust accredited vendor
- EHR integration is available





FL-HIE

Event Notification Service

- The Event Notification Service (ENS) provides timely notice of a patient's hospital encounter to the patient's health plan
- ENS can benefit hospitals, patients, and health plans
 - Enhanced post-discharge care coordination (including contact information for follow-up)
 - Supports efforts to shift the setting of care for non-urgent conditions from the emergency department to primary care
 - Reduced readmissions rates for hospitals



FL-HIE How ENS Works


- Participating hospitals provide the FL-HIE with notice of patient hospital encounters as they occur
- Health plans subscribe by providing the FL-HIE with a list of active members for whom they'd like notifications
- ENS compares hospital notices to the health plan member lists; if a match is made, notice of the patient's hospital encounter is securely delivered to the subscribing plan
 - Matching is based on patient demographics (name, DOB, etc.), not self-reported health plan membership
 - No database exists for ENS either the notice passes through to the subscribing plan or the notice is discarded



FL-HIE ENS Hospital Participants

 206 hospitals are providing patient hospital encounter data through ENS


 ENS covers over 80% of all Florida hospital beds





FL-HIE ENS Health Plan Subscribers

- Nearly 1 million patients are currently being served through the connections made by subscribed Florida's health plans and Accountable Care Organizations (ACO)
 - Integral
 - Molina
 - Sunshine State
 - WellCare Health Plans
 - Primary Partners ACO
 - Palm Beach ACO
 - Aledade ACO





eHealth Exchange

- Formerly the Nationwide Health Information Network
 - An initiative for the national exchange of health care information
- The FL-HIE is connected to the eHealth Exchange
 - Health care providers participating in the FL-HIE can exchange health information with eHealth Exchange participants for disability determination or access to records for emergency department patients
- Florida law requires explicit consent to access certain patient information; eHealth Exchange partners must comply with this requirement



Telemedicine Services

- Telemedicine services are available to Medicaid recipients in the Managed Medical Assistance (MMA) and fee-for-service programs for the following services:
 - Behavioral health
 - Dental
 - Physician
 - Interpretation of diagnostic testing results by Florida licensed physicians.
- MMA plans are allowed to offer telemedicine for most covered services with Agency approval
- Significant provider innovations within existing regulations reducing readmissions, transitions of care
