The term does not include the killing of a person in the care and custody of a state agency. For purposes of this subsection, the term "care and custody of a state agency" includes, but is not limited to, a child abuse protective investigation, protective supervision, foster care and related services, a protective investigation or protective supervision of a vulnerable adult, or correctional supervision, as defined in chapter 39, chapter 409, chapter 415, or chapter 945.

28 (2) A photograph or video or audio recording that depicts 29 or records the killing of a person law enforcement officer who 30 was acting in accordance with his or her official duties is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I 31 of the State Constitution, except that a surviving spouse of the 32 33 decedent may view and copy any such photograph or video 34 recording or listen to or copy any such audio recording. If 35 there is no surviving spouse, then the surviving parents shall 36 have access to such records. If there is no surviving spouse or 37 parent, the then an adult children child shall have access to such records. 38

(3) (a) The deceased's surviving relative, with whom 39 authority rests to obtain such records, may designate in writing 40 41 an agent to obtain such records.

(c) In all cases, the viewing, copying, listening to, or other handling of a photograph or video or audio recording that depicts or records the killing of a <u>person</u> law enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her official duties must be under the direct supervision of the custodian of the record or his or her designee.

77 (5) A surviving spouse shall be given reasonable notice of 78 a petition filed with the court to view or copy a photograph or 79 video recording that depicts or records the killing of a person 80 law enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or 81 her official duties or to listen to or copy any such audio 82 recording, a copy of such petition, and reasonable notice of the 83 opportunity to be present and heard at any hearing on the matter. If there is no surviving spouse, then such notice must 84 85 be given to the parents of the deceased and, if the deceased has 86 no surviving living parent, then to the adult children of the 87 deceased.

Such photographs 134 and video and audio recordings provide a view of the deceased in 135 the final moments of life, often bruised, bloodied, broken, with 136 bullet wounds or other wounds, cut open, dismembered, or decapitated. As such, photographs and video and audio recordings 137 138 that depict or record the killing of a person are highly sensitive representations of the deceased which, if heard, 139 viewed, copied, or publicized, could result in trauma, sorrow, 140 humiliation, or emotional injury to the immediate family of the 141 PCB APC 18-08 a1

142 deceased and detract from the memory of the deceased. The 143 Legislature recognizes that the existence of the Internet and 144 the proliferation of personal computers and cell<u>ular telephones</u> 145 throughout the world encourages and promotes the wide 146 dissemination of such photographs and video and audio recordings 147 24 hours a day and that widespread unauthorized dissemination of 148 such photographs and video and audio recordings would subject 149 the immediate family of the deceased to continuous injury. 150 (2) In addition to the emotional and mental injury that 151 these photographs and recordings may cause family members, the 152 Legislature is also concerned that dissemination of photographs 153 and video and audio recordings that depict or record the killing 154 of a person is harmful to the public. The Legislature is gravely concerned and saddened by the horrific mass killings perpetrated 155 156 at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando and the Fort Lauderdale-157 Hollywood International Airport. The Legislature is concerned 158 that, if these photographs and recordings are released, terrorists will use them to attract followers, bring attention 159 160 to their causes, and inspire others to kill. The Legislature 161 also finds that dissemination of these photographs and 162 recordings may also educe violent acts by the mentally ill or 163 morally corrupt.
