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this record is a trade secret as defined in s. 688.01, Florida Statutes.

[...I have/my company has...] taken measures to prevent the disclosure of the record or specific portion of a record claimed to be a trade secret to anyone other than those who have been selected to have access for limited purposes, and [...I intend/my company intends...] to continue to take such measures.

The record or specific portion of a record claimed to be a trade secret is not, and has not been, reasonably obtainable without [...my/our...] consent by other persons by use of legitimate means.

The record or specific portion of a record claimed to be a trade secret is not publicly available elsewhere.

## (4) RESPONSE TO A REQUEST FOR PUBLIC RECORDS. -

(a) If an agency receives a request for a public record and the requested record or a specific portion of the record is marked and verified as containing a trade secret, the agency shall, as soon as practical, notify the person who requested the record or specific portion of the record that is marked and verified as containing a trade secret. The notice must inform the person who requested such record of the process outlined in paragraph (b) and direct such person to respond to the notice if he or she desires access to the record marked and verified as containing a trade secret.

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- (b) If the person who requested the record indicates he or she desires access to the requested record or a specific portion of the record that has been marked and verified as containing a trade secret, the agency shall promptly notify the person who verified the record, or specific portion of the record, as containing a trade secret of the request. The notice shall be sent to the address provided to the agency and must inform such person that, in order to avoid disclosure of the trade secret, the person must file an action in circuit court within 30 days after the date of the notice seeking a declaratory judgment that the record in question contains a trade secret and an order barring public disclosure of the record. - (b) In addition to the other requirements of this chapter, except for those that are inconsistent with or superseded by the planning standards of this paragraph, the detailed specific area plans shall be consistent with the long-term master plan and must include conditions and commitments that provide for:
- 1. Development or conservation of an area of at least 1,000 acres consistent with the long-term master plan. The local government may approve detailed specific area plans of less than 1,000 acres based on local circumstances if it is determined that the detailed specific area plan furthers the purposes of this part and part I of chapter 380.
- 2. Detailed identification and analysis of the maximum and minimum densities and intensities of use and the distribution, extent, and location of future land uses.
- 3. Detailed identification of water resource development and water supply development projects and related infrastructure and water conservation measures to address water needs of development in the detailed specific area plan.
- 4. Detailed identification of the transportation facilities to serve the future land uses in the detailed specific area plan.
- 5. Detailed identification of other regionally significant public facilities, including public facilities outside the jurisdiction of the host local government, impacts

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- of future land uses on those facilities, and required improvements consistent with the long-term master plan.
- 6. Public facilities necessary to serve development in the detailed specific area plan, including developer contributions in a 5-year capital improvement schedule of the affected local government.
- 7. Detailed analysis and identification of specific measures to ensure the protection and, as appropriate, restoration and management of lands within the boundary of the detailed specific area plan identified for permanent preservation through recordation of conservation easements consistent with s. 704.06, which easements shall be effective before or concurrent with the effective date of the detailed specific area plan and other important resources both within and outside the host jurisdiction. Any such conservation easement may be based on digital orthophotography prepared by a surveyor and mapper licensed under chapter 472 and may include a right of adjustment authorizing the grantor to modify portions of the area protected by a conservation easement and substitute other lands in their place if the lands to be substituted contain no less gross acreage than the lands to be removed; have equivalent values in the proportion and quality of wetlands, uplands, and wildlife habitat; and are contiquous to other lands protected by the conservation easement. Substitution is accomplished by recording an amendment to the conservation easement as accepted

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by and with the consent of the grantee, and which consent may not be unreasonably withheld.

- development order, a local government shall not include or impose as a development order condition any requirement that a developer contribute or pay for land acquisition or construction or expansion of public facilities or portions thereof unless the local government has enacted a local ordinance which requires other development not within a sector planning area to contribute its proportionate share of the funds, land, or public facilities necessary to accommodate any impacts having a rational nexus to the proposed development. An approval or denial of the application for a detailed specific area plan or related development order approval must include written findings supporting the local government decision.

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A detailed specific area plan adopted by local development order pursuant to this section may be based upon a planning period longer than the generally applicable planning period of the local comprehensive plan and shall specify the projected population within the specific planning area during the chosen planning period. (w) Managerial employees, as defined in s. 447.203(4), confidential employees, as defined in s. 447.203(5), and supervisory employees who spend the majority of their time communicating with, motivating, training, and evaluating employees, and planning and directing employees' work, and who have the authority to hire, transfer, suspend, lay off, recall, promote, discharge, assign, reward, or discipline subordinate employees or effectively recommend such action, including all employees serving as supervisors, administrators, and directors. Excluded are employees also designated as special risk or special risk administrative support and attorneys who serve as administrative law judges pursuant to s. 120.65 or for hearings

120.65 Administrative law judges.—

(1) The Division of Administrative Hearings within the Department of Management Services shall be headed by the a director of the Division of Administrative Hearings. The director who shall be appointed by the Administration Commission and must be a full-time administrative law judge employed by the division and confirmed by the Senate. The director, who shall also serve as the chief administrative law judge, and any deputy chief administrative law judge must possess the same minimum qualifications as the administrative law judges employed by the division. The Deputy Chief Judge of Compensation Claims must possess the minimum qualifications established in s. 440.45(2) and shall report to the director. The division is shall be a separate budget entity, and the director shall be its agency

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head for all purposes. The Department of Management Services shall provide administrative support and service to the division to the extent requested by the director. The division shall not be subject to control, supervision, or direction by the Department of Management Services in any manner, including, but not limited to, personnel, purchasing, transactions involving real or personal property, and budgetary matters.

- (2) The Governor and Cabinet shall appoint full-time administrative law judges to conduct hearings in accordance with this chapter. A person may not serve as an administrative law judge unless he or she has been a member of The Florida Bar in good standing for the previous 5 years. An administrative law judge may not engage in the private practice of law during his or her term of office.
- (a)1. Except as provided in paragraph (b), the Governor and Cabinet shall appoint an administrative law judge from a list of three persons nominated by a statewide nominating commission. The statewide nominating commission shall be composed of three members, at least one of whom must be a minority person as defined in s. 288.703, appointed by the Governor; two members appointed by the Attorney General; two members appointed by the Chief Financial Officer; and two members appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture.
- 2. Beginning July 1, 2018, the Governor and each member of the Cabinet shall appoint one member to serve a 2-year term and

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appoint the remaining members to serve 4-year terms. Thereafter, each member shall be appointed for a 4-year term. A vacancy occurring on the commission shall be filled by the original appointing authority for the unexpired balance of the term.

- 3. The meetings and determinations of the nominating commission as to the administrative law judges shall be open to the public.
- Each administrative law judge shall be appointed for a 4-year term, but during his or her term of office may be removed by the Governor and Cabinet for cause. Before the expiration of a judge's term of office, the statewide nominating commission shall review the judge's conduct and determine whether the judge's performance is satisfactory. In determining whether a judge's performance is satisfactory, the commission shall consider the extent to which the judge has met the requirements of this chapter. The commission shall report its finding to the Governor and Cabinet no later than 6 months before the expiration of the judge's term of office. The Governor and Cabinet shall review the commission's report and may reappoint the administrative law judge for an additional 4-year term. If the Governor and Cabinet do not reappoint the judge, the Governor and Cabinet shall inform the commission. The judge shall remain in office until the Governor and Cabinet have appointed a successor judge in accordance with this subsection. If a vacancy occurs during a judge's unexpired term, the

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commission does not find the judge's performance satisfactory, or the Governor and Cabinet do not reappoint the judge, the Governor and Cabinet shall appoint a successor judge for a 4-year term in accordance with paragraph (a).

- (c) The Governor and Cabinet shall appoint each administrative law judge by June 30, 2019, for a term beginning on July 1, 2019. For the term beginning on July 1, 2019, administrative law judges shall be appointed in the following manner: 8 judges appointed to a 1-year term; 8 judges appointed to a 2-year term; 8 judges appointed to a 3-year term; and 8 judges appointed to a 4-year term. Thereafter, each term of office shall be 4 years.
- (d) The Division of Administrative Hearings shall maintain 32 administrative law judges as they existed on June 30, 2018. Each administrative law judge may continue to serve until June 30, 2019, and may be appointed for an additional term under the process for reappointments in paragraph (b).
- (3)(2) The director has the right to appeal actions by the Executive Office of the Governor that affect amendments to the division's approved operating budget or any personnel actions pursuant to chapter 216 to the Administration Commission, which shall decide such issue by majority vote. The appropriations committees may advise the Administration Commission on the issue. If the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives object in writing to the effects of the
