



Lavon Reese's family isn't upset the woman responsible for her death during a high-speed, distracted driving crash was sentenced to only three years in prison.

But now, their mission is to push lawmakers to change what they say are Florida's weak texting while driving laws.

Reese, a 24-year-old Florida State University student from St. Petersburg, was killed in a 2015 crash.

The driver of the other vehicle, Ashli Harvey, was texting while driving 89 mph along North Monroe Street near the intersection of Talpeco Road. She was sentenced to prison last month after entering into a plea deal.

Gwendolyn Reese (St. Petersburg, FL), Lavon's aunt, and her son, Jeffery Peaten, are working to connect with lawmakers already leading the charge to change the law to make texting while driving a primary traffic offense.

Right now, drivers cannot be cited simply for using their phone while driving.




Driving Behaviors of Young Millennials
