Remove lines 19-34 and insert:

6 (2)(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), a
 7 political subdivision may not establish, mandate, maintain, or
 8 otherwise require an employer to pay a minimum wage, other than
 9 a state or federal minimum wage, to apply a state or federal
 10 minimum wage to wages exempt from a state or federal minimum
 11 wage, or to provide employment benefits not otherwise required
 12 by state or federal law.

13 (b) No political subdivision may through its purchasing or
 14 contracting procedures seek to control or affect the wages or
 15 employment benefits provided by its vendors, contractors,
 16 service providers, or other parties doing business with the

17 political subdivision. A political subdivision shall not through
18 the use of evaluation factors, qualification of bidders, or
19 otherwise award preferences on the basis of wages or employment
20 benefits provided by its vendors, contractors, service
21 providers, or other parties doing business with the political
22 subdivision. This paragraph only applies to contracts,
23 purchasing or contracting procedures, evaluation factors,
24 qualifications of bidders, or other award preferences adopted by
25 the political subdivision related to wages or employment
26 benefits provided by vendors, contractors, service providers or
27 other parties doing business with the political subdivision
28 entered into on or after the date this act becomes law.
