- (2)(a) It is unlawful for a person, after receiving a warning not to approach from a person he or she knows or reasonably should know is a first responder, who is engaged in the lawful performance of a legal duty, to knowingly and willfully violate such warning and approach or remain within 20 feet of the first responder with the intent to:
- 1. Interrupt, disrupt, hinder, impede, or interfere with the first responder's ability to perform such duty;
 - 2. Threaten the first responder with physical harm; or
- 3. Harass the first responder or make so much noise that a first responder is prevented from performing his or her official duties or providing medical aid.
- (b) A person who violates this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
