Paragraph (b) of subsection (6) of section 1002.45, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 19

(6) VIRTUAL INSTRUCTION PROGRAM AND VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING.—

1002.45 Virtual instruction programs. -

(b) Students enrolled in a virtual instruction program shall be funded in the Florida Education Finance Program as provided in the General Appropriations Act. The calculation to

Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (6) of section 1003.4282, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.4282 Requirements for a standard high school diploma.—

- (6) AWARD OF A STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA. -
- (c) A student who earns the required 24 credits, or the required 18 credits under s. 1002.3105(5), but fails to pass the assessments required under s. 1008.22(3) or achieve a 2.0 GPA shall be awarded a certificate of completion in a form prescribed by the State Board of Education. However, a student who is otherwise entitled to a certificate of completion may elect to remain in high school either as a full-time student or a part-time student for up to 1 additional year and receive special instruction designed to remedy his or her identified deficiencies.
 - 1. The school district must notify each student entitled

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writing, of the option for the student to remain in high school for up to 1 additional year to receive special instruction to remedy his or her identified deficiencies and graduate with a standard high school diploma. The notification must include the contact information of a certified school counselor who can advise the student and his or her parents on this option.

- 2. If the student elects to be awarded a certificate of completion and declines the additional year of instruction, the student's certified school counselor or other school personnel shall inform the student of opportunities to continue his or her education through eligible postsecondary, workforce, and adult education programs.
- 3. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to monitor compliance with the requirements of this paragraph.

Section 3. Paragraphs (q) through (t) of subsection (1) of section 1011.62, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs (r) through (u), and a new paragraph (q) is added to that subsection, to read:

1011.62 Funds for operation of schools.—If the annual allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each district for operation of schools is not determined in the annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as follows:

(1) COMPUTATION OF THE BASIC AMOUNT TO BE INCLUDED FOR OPERATION.—The following procedure shall be followed in determining the annual allocation to each district for operation:

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(g) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on the award of standard high school diplomas to students eligible for a certificate of completion.—A value of 0.5 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student who is entitled to a certificate of completion who elects to remain in high school for up to 1 additional year pursuant to s. 1003.4282(6)(c) and is awarded a standard high school diploma. Such value shall be added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year. Each school district shall allocate the funds received from the bonus FTE funding under this paragraph to the schools whose students generate the funds. Funds shall be expended solely for the payment of special instruction and support services to students eligible for a certificate of completion who elect to remain in high school for up to 1 additional year pursuant to s. 1003.4282(6)(c).

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
