BILLS FILED FOR THE 2014 REGULAR SESSION

HB 1 by Rehwinkel Vasilinda, Berman, Pafford, Stewart

Genetically Engineered Foods; Provides list of commercial commodities commonly cultivated in genetically engineered form; requires DACS to publish list by specified date & annualy update list; provides mandatory labeling requirements for genetically engineered raw agricultural commodities & processed foods made with or derived from genetically engineered ingredients; provides for enforcement of labeling requirements; provides civil remedies & penalties. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 3 by Ray, Broxson (Similar SB 136)

Freight Logistics Zones; Defines "freight logistics zone"; authorizes county or two or more contiguous counties to designate geographic area(s) within its jurisdiction as freight logistics zone; requires adoption of strategic plan which must include certain information; provides that certain projects within freight logistics zones may be eligible for priority in state funding & certain incentive programs; provides evaluation criteria for freight logistics zones. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 5 by Slosberg, Hood, Stewart

Traffic Safety; Creates Minor Traffic Safety Act; prohibits use of electronic communications devices by drivers younger than 18 years of age; provides for voluntary contributions to AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety on driver license applications. Effective Date: January 1, 2015

HB 7 by Diaz, J., Diaz, M.

Florida Kidcare Program; Defines term "lawfully residing child"; revises eligibility for Kidcare program; excludes undocumented immigrants from eligibility; provides eligibility for optional payments for medical assistance & related services for certain lawfully residing children; excludes undocumented immigrants from eligibility for optional Medicaid payments or related services. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 9 by Nuñez (Identical SB 72)

Legislative Session Dates; Fixes date for convening regular session of Legislature in even-numbered years. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 11 by Steube, Spano (Compare SB 176)

Tax On Sales, Use & Other Transactions; Provides for incremental reduction of tax imposed on rental or license fees charged for use of commercial real property; provides for future repeal of tax. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 13 by Stewart

Rental Car Surcharges; Authorizes counties to impose an additional surcharge on lease or rental of motor vehicles; requires referendum approval. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HM 15 by Van Zant (Identical SM 118)

Fair Tax Act of 2013; Urges Congress to repeal all taxes on income & enact national retail sales tax as specified in H.R. 25, Fair Tax Act of 2013.

HB 17 by Slosberg, Hood, Van Zant

Motorist Safety; Authorizes governing body of county to create yellow dot critical motorist medical information program to make critical medical information readily available to responders in event of motor vehicle accident or medical emergency involving a participant's vehicle; authorizes county to solicit sponsorships for program & enter into interlocal agreement with another county to solicit such sponsorships. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 19 by Slosberg

Public Records/Yellow Dot Critical Motorist Medical Information Program; Provides exemption from public records requirements for specified identifying information, medical records, & medical information of participants in yellow dot critical motorist medical information program; providing for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 17 or similar legislation authorizing the governing body of a county to create a yellow dot critical motorist medical information program takes effect

HB 21 by Porter (Similar SB 106)

County Employees; Authorizes governing body of county to determine available benefits of county employees; provides for applicability of certain provisions relating to Florida Retirement System. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 23 by Rogers, Antone, Berman, Clarke-Reed, Hood, Jones, S., Stewart, Waldman (Similar SB 160)

Canned or Perishable Food Distributed Free of Charge; Limits liability of public schools with respect to donation of canned or perishable food to charitable or nonprofit organizations. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 25 by Mayfield, Broxson, Eagle, Van Zant

Public School Curricular Standards and Assessments;

Prohibits State Board of Education from continuing to implement common core standards until certain requirements are met; provides requirements for adoption or revision of curricular standards; requires state to withdraw from PARCC; prohibits state from implementing certain assessments & requires state to adopt & implement new assessments; prohibits state board from entering into certain agreements. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 27 by Diaz, J.

Cost-effective Purchasing of Health Care; Extends authorization period for AHCA to enter into contracts on prepaid or fixed-sum basis with prepaid dental health plans to provide dental services; limits provision of prepaid dental health programs to Miami-Dade County; authorizes AHCA to seek federal waivers or amendments to state plan. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 29 by Pilon, Edwards (Similar SB 114)

Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Authorizes mobile home park owner to increase lot rental of purchaser of mobile home on leased lot in mobile home park; provides limitations on amount of rent increase; provides guidelines for determining amount of adjustment; requires disclosure statement to be executed at time of purchase; limits amount of lot rental increase on lot that was previously subject to lifetime lease; provides penalty. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 31 by Renuart, Harrell, Hooper, Tobia (Identical SB 86)

action; provides that law enforcement agency's right & duty to fully investigate use of force upon which claim of immunity is based is not restricted; deletes provision that prohibits law enforcement agency from arresting person for using force unless probable cause is found that force used was unlawful; revises when defense of justifiable use of force is unavailable to aggressor; directs FDLE to collect data alleged justifiable use of force incidents & report. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 35 by Peters, Fitzenhagen, Ahern, Caldwell, Hill, Hood, Raschein, Rehwinkel Vasilinda, Steube (Compare CS/SB 84)

Resident Status for Tuition Purposes; Provides criteria for veterans of U.S. Armed Services, including reserve components thereof, to qualify as residents for tuition purposes. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 37 by Campbell

Involuntary Examinations Under the Baker Act; Authorizes physician assistants & ARNPs to initiate involuntary examinations under Baker Act of persons believed to have mental illness. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 39 by Bracy (Compare SB 94)

Juries in Criminal Trials; Requires that jury in trial of felony case be made up of 12 persons. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 41 by Campbell

Florida Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Fame; Establishes Florida Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Fame; provides for administration by FDLE; designates location; provides procedures for selection, nomination, & induction. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 43 by Campbell (Compare HB 53)

Inmate Reentry; Waiving fee for identification cards issued to certain inmates & for certain inmates receiving copy of birth certificate; requires DOC to work with other agencies in acquiring necessary documents for certain inmates; provides exceptions; requires DOC to provide specified assistance to inmates born outside this state; requires report; authorizes DOC to operate male & female faith- & character-based institutions; directs DOC to establish reentry program for nonviolent offenders; provides eligibility & participation requirements; provides guidelines where DOC shall terminate inmate's participation in program; provides for inmate to participate in drug offender probation upon completion of in-prison reentry program; authorizes use of postadjudicatory drug court for program participant; authorizes DOC to contract for services; provides that no rights are conferred upon inmates to participate in reentry program; provides for reports & rulemaking. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 45 by Bracy (Similar SB 96)

Requirements for Driver Licenses; Includes notice of approval of application for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals status issued by U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services as valid proof of identity for purposes of applying for driver license. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 47 by Raschein, Hood (Similar SB 194)

Crustaceans; Provides that certain violations relating to spiny lobsters & stone crabs are separate & distinct offenses. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 49 by Stewart (Similar SB 76)

Springs Revival Act; Requires water management districts to identify certain springs, develop certain plans, & submit certain reports; authorizes districts to adopt rules & issue orders. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 51 by Fullwood

Resident Status for Tuition Purposes; Prohibits dependent child who is U.S. citizen from being denied classification as resident for tuition purposes based solely upon citizenship status of his or her parent. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 53 by Stone, Baxley (Compare HB 43)

Inmate Reentry; Waives fee for identification cards issued to certain inmates; requires waiver of fees for certain inmates receiving copy of birth certificate; requires DOC to work with other agencies in acquiring necessary documents for certain inmates to acquire identification card before release; provides exceptions; requires DOC to provide specified assistance to inmates born outside state; authorizes DOC to operate male & female faith- & character-based institutions. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 55 by Gonzalez (Identical SB 102)

Aaron Cohen Life Protection Act; Creates "Aaron Cohen Life Protection Act"; requires driver of vehicle involved in crash that results in serious bodily injury to person to immediately stop vehicle & remain at scene of crash; provides penalties. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 57 by Stark (Identical SB 138)

Meetings of District School Boards; Requires district school boards to convene at least one regular meeting during evening hours each quarter during school year & to establish written criteria for convening such meeting; provides that district school board is deemed to be in compliance under certain circumstances; revises requirements for calling special meeting. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 59 by Ahern (Similar SB 162)

Offenses Against Unborn Children; Creates "Florida Unborn Victims of Violence Act"; provides rule of construction that person who engages in conduct that violates Florida Criminal Code or criminal offense defined by another statute & causes death of, or bodily injury to unborn child commits separate offense if such offense is not specifically provided for; provides for penalties; specifies that certain types of knowledge or intent are not necessary for such offense; provides exceptions; revises definitions & terminology. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

HB 61 by Hill, Hood, Santiago (Identical SB 156)

Motor Vehicle License Taxes; Reduces service charge imposed on application for original or duplicate license plate, or transfer of specified registration stickers or certificates; reduces fee collected for motor vehicle registration; reduces surcharges imposed on license tax. Effective Date: September 1, 2014

HB 63 by Campbell (Compare SB 158)

Transportation Facility Designations; Provides honorary designations of various transportation facilities in specified counties; directs DOT to erect suitable markers; authorizes department to permit erection of specified marker under certain conditions. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 65 by Hooper, **Roberson**, **K.** (Identical SB 132)

Specialty License Plates/Fallen Law Enforcement Officers; Creates Fallen Law Enforcement Officers license plate; establishes annual use fee for plate; provides for distribution of use fees received from sale of such plates. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

HB 67 by Gaetz

Powers and Duties of District School Boards; Provides requirements for district school board policies for high school daily start times. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 69 by Pritchett

Pub. Rec./Names of Spouses and Children of Public Defenders and Criminal Conflict and Civil Regional Counsel; Creates exemption from public records requirements for names of spouses & children of current or former public defenders, assistant public defenders, criminal conflict & civil regional counsel, & assistant criminal conflict & civil regional counsel; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

HB 71 by Rodrigues, R.

Fracturing Chemical Usage Disclosure Act; Creates

"Fracturing Chemical Usage Disclosure Act"; directs DEP to establish online hydraulic fracturing chemical registry; requires service providers, vendors, & owners or operators of wells on which hydraulic fracturing treatments are performed to disclose certain information; provides exceptions; authorizes DEP to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 73 by Edwards, Baxley, Moskowitz, Perry, Pilon (Identical SB 182)

Sexual Offenders; Prohibits certain probationers or community controllees from viewing, accessing, owning, or possessing any obscene, pornographic, or sexually stimulating material, regardless of its relevance to offender's behavior pattern. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 75 by Pilon, Caldwell

Presidential Electors; Revises manner in which presidential electors are nominated, elected, & vote; provides that one elector shall be elected from each congressional district & two electors shall be elected at large, based upon which candidate wins majority of congressional district seats; provides conforming provisions. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 77 by Waldman, Edwards (Similar SB 146)

Student Loans; Provides for financial assistance program administered by Justice Administrative Commission & Office of Attorney General to assist career assistant state attorney, assistant public defender, assistant regional counsel, assistant attorney general, or assistant statewide prosecutor in repayment of eligible student loans; requires administering body to make payment of certain amount based on length of employment as eligible career attorney; provides for funding. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 79 by Reed (Identical SB 124)

Classroom Materials; Requires district school boards to give classroom teachers debit cards that are funded through Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program to purchase materials & supplies before start of school year. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HM 81 by Caldwell

Congressional Term Limits; Urges Congress to propose to states amendment to Constitution of United States that would limit consecutive terms of office that member of U.S. Senate or U.S. House of Representatives may serve.

HB 83 by Saunders (Compare HB 87)

Arts for All Students Act; Creates "Arts for All Students Act"; requires DOE to publish "Arts for All Students" annual report; provides components of fine arts curriculum; requires criteria & formula for granting "Arts for All Students" model school & model school district designations; provides for annual award of designations. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 85 by Lee

Literacy Jump Start Pilot Project; Requires DOE to establish pilot project in St. Lucie County to assist low-income, at-risk children in developing emergent literacy skills; requires DOE to select organization to implement pilot project; provides eligibility requirements for participation; requires background screening for personnel & emergent literacy training for instructors; requires DOE to allocate funds for pilot project. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 87 by McBurney (Compare HB 83)

Fine Arts Courses; Requires Commissioner of Education to prepare annual report relating to student access to & participation in fine arts courses & information on educators, facilities, & instruction in such courses. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 89 by Combee, Edwards, Baxley

Defense of Life, Home, and Property; Provides that defensive display of weapon or firearm, including discharge of firearm for purpose of warning shot, does not constitute use of deadly force; provides immunity from prosecution for persons acting in defense of life, home, & property from violent attack or threat of violent attack through certain displays of or uses of force; limits specified provision authorizing use of deadly force by law enforcement or correctional officers; provides exemption from minimum sentence requirements related to use of weapon or firearm for persons acting in self-defense or defense of others; authorizes departure from minimum sentence requirements related to use of weapon or firearm for persons convicted of certain offenses who were not immune from prosecution but who meet specified requirements. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 91 by Roberson, K.

State Ombudsman Program; Reorganizes long-term ombudsman services; provides duties of Office of State Long-Term Care Ombudsman & State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Council; provides conditions under which representative of office could be found to have conflict of interest; provides immunity from liability for representative of office; requires long-term care facilities to provide representatives of office with access to facilities, residents, & records for certain purposes; provides for office to coordinate ombudsman services with Disability Rights Florida. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 93 by Reed (Identical SB 178)

Disability Awareness; Requires district school board to provide disability history & awareness instruction in K-12 public schools; provides for presenters who have disabilities to augment instruction; requires school to establish disability history & awareness advisory council. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 95 by Clarke-Reed (Similar SB 210)

Juvenile Civil Citations; Requires that law enforcement officer, upon making contact with juvenile who admits having committed misdemeanor, issue civil citation in certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 97 by Magar (Similar SB 142)

Dentists & Dental Hygienists; Revises definition of term "contract"; requires that contract with governmental contractor for health care services include provision allowing voluntary contribution toward certain dental laboratory work; provides that contribution may not exceed actual amount of dental laboratory charges. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 99 by Edwards, Hood, Baxley, Pilon, Stewart

Sentencing for Controlled Substance Violations; Designates act "Elizabeth Dillinger Act"; revises criminal penalties for persons engaged in illegal trafficking of prescription drugs involving specified quantities of oxycodone or hydrocodone. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 101 by Jones, M.

Habitual Traffic Offender Designations; Provides for removal of habitual traffic offender designation upon proof of compliance with specified statutory provisions. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 103 by Jones, M. (Identical SB 112)

Possession or Discharge of a Firearm or Destructive Device During Commission of Specified Offenses; Provides that sentencing court may elect not to impose minimum term of imprisonment for person convicted of certain offenses during which person actually possessed or discharged firearm or destructive device if court finds that certain specified criteria are met; requires sentencing court that elects not to impose mandatory minimum sentence for relevant offense to make specific findings to support its decision to impose lesser term. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 105 by Berman, Pafford, Schwartz (Identical SB 220)

Florida Civil Rights Act; Prohibits discrimination on basis of pregnancy in specified establishments; prohibits employment discrimination on basis of pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions; prohibits discrimination on basis of pregnancy by labor organizations, joint labor-management committees, employment agencies, or in licensing. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 107 by Stark

Driver Licenses; Provides for person adjudicated mentally or physically incompetent to surrender his or her driver license to court; directs court to send license with record of adjudication to DHSMV. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 109 by Gibbons

Pub. Rec./Participants in Treatment-Based Drug Court Programs; Exempts from public records requirements information from initial screenings for participation in treatment-based drug court program, substance abuse screenings, behavioral health evaluations, & subsequent treatment status reports regarding a participant or person considered for participation in treatment-based drug court program; provides for future repeal & legislative review of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 111 by Gibbons

Pub. Rec./Forensic Behavioral Health Evaluations; Creates exemption from public records requirements for forensic behavioral health evaluation filed with court; defines "forensic behavioral health evaluation"; authorizes release of such evaluations; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 113 by Fresen (Similar SB 66)

Discretionary Sales Surtaxes; Authorizes county to levy surtax up to specified amount for benefit of Florida College System institution & state university in county pursuant to ordinance conditioned to take effect upon approval in referendum; requires ordinance to include plan for use of proceeds; provides referendum requirements & procedures; requires that proceeds from surtax be transferred into specified account & managed in specified manner; establishes oversight board with specified duties, responsibilities, & requirements relating to expenditure of surtax proceeds; provides for appointment of members of oversight board; requires that board of trustees of each institution receiving surtax proceeds prepare annual plan for submission to oversight board for approval; provides that state funding may not be reduced because institution receives surtax funds; provides for scheduled expiration of surtax. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 115 by Pigman

Public Meetings/University Direct Support Organization;

Provides exemption from public meeting requirements for portion of meeting of board of directors of university DSO, or of executive committee or other committees of board, at which identity of donor or prospective donor, proposal seeking research funding from organization, or plan or program for initiating or supporting research is discussed; provides for review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

HB 117 by Ray

Public Retirement Plans; Specifies applicability of ch. 185, F.S., to certain consolidated governments; provides that consolidated government that has entered into interlocal agreement to provide police protection services to municipality within its boundaries is eligible to receive premium taxes reported for municipality; authorizes municipality receiving police protection services to enact an ordinance levying tax as

provided by law; including certain consolidated governments under provisions authorizing imposition of state excise tax on casualty insurance premiums covering certain property. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HJR 119 by Rader

Real Property Rights of Aliens Ineligible for Citizenship; Proposes amendment to s. 2, Art. I of State Constitution to delete provision authorizing laws that regulate or prohibit ownership, inheritance, disposition, & possession of real property by aliens ineligible for citizenship.

HB 121 by Raburn

Agricultural Lands Classification; Provides that participation in water retention program may be considered nonincome-producing use under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 123 by Schwartz (Identical SB 120, Compare SB 108)

Fees and Costs in Guardianship Proceedings; Provides that fees & costs incurred by attorney who has rendered services to ward in compensation proceedings are payable from guardianship assets; provides that expert testimony is unnecessary in proceedings to determine compensation for attorney or guardian; provides that court may appoint guardian ad litem to minor if necessary to protect minor's interests in settlement; provides that settlement of minor's claim is subject to certain confidentiality provisions; directs that examining committee be paid from state funds as court-appointed expert witnesses if petition for incapacity is dismissed; requires that petitioner reimburse state for expert witness fees if court finds petition to have been filed in bad faith. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 125 by Schwartz (Similar SB 108, Compare SB 120)

Pub. Rec./Claim Settlement on Behalf of Minor or Ward;

Creates exemption from public records requirements for records relating to settlement of claim on behalf of minor or ward; authorizes guardian ad litem, ward, minor, & minor's attorney to inspect guardianship reports & court records relating to settlement of claim on behalf of minor or ward, upon showing of good cause; authorizes court to direct disclosure & recording of amendment to report or court records relating to settlement of claim on behalf of ward or minor, in connection with real property or for other purposes; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 123 or similar legislation takes effect if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law

HB 127 by Brodeur, Santiago, Hutson (Identical SB 208)

Motorsports Entertainment Complexes; Provides for monthly distribution of specified amount of sales tax revenue to complex certified as motorsports entertainment complex by DEO; revises definition of term "motorsports entertainment complex"; revises requirements for certification of facility as motorsports entertainment complex; specifies that DEO may certify only one

motorsports entertainment complex; authorizes Auditor General to verify expenditure of specified distributions & to notify DOR of improperly expended funds. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 129 by Raburn

Insurance; Requires Citizens Property Insurance Corporation to submit biannual report on number of residential sinkhole policies issued & declined; provides legislative findings; establishing Citizens Sinkhole Stabilization Repair Program for sinkhole claims; provides program components; specifies corporation's liability with respect to sinkhole claims; requires corporation to offer specified deductible amounts for sinkhole loss coverage. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 131 by Hager

Henry Morrison Flagler Memorial; Establishes Henry Morrison Flagler Memorial; requires DMS to designate location for memorial in Capitol courtyard & consult with Henry Morrison Flagler Museum regarding construction, installation, & management of memorial; provides for creation of figurative bronze sculpture to be installed in memorial. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 133 by Rogers (Identical SB 192)

Legislative Lobbying Expenditures; Revises term

"expenditure" to exclude use of public facility or public property that is made available by governmental entity to legislator for public purpose, to exempt such use from legislative lobbying requirements; provides exceptions when member or employee of Legislature may accept certain expenditures made by lobbyist or principal; provides reporting requirements; requires each house of Legislature to establish rules governing reporting procedures; provides for future expiration & reversion as of specified date of statutory text. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 135 by Kerner

Public Records & Public Meetings/Postsecondary Education Executive Search; Provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of applicant for president, provost, or dean of state university or Florida College System institution; provides exemption from public meeting requirements for meeting held for purpose of identifying or vetting applicants for president, provost, or dean of state university or Florida College System institution & for portion of meeting held for purpose of establishing qualifications of, or compensation framework to be offered to, potential applicants that would disclose personal identifying information of applicant or potential applicant; requires release of names of specified applicants within certain timeframe; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

HB 137 by Hudson

Edison State College; Renames Edison State College as "Florida South Western State College." Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 139 by Jones, S.

Volunteers for Organized Youth Sports and Recreational Programs; Defines "volunteer" & "youth sports or recreation authority"; expands provisions relating to athletic coaches for independent sanctioning authorities to require youth sports or recreation authorities to conduct specified background screening of all volunteers with any youth athletic team or organized youth recreational program using publicly owned facilities; provides that duty may not be delegated; requires that specified documentation be maintained for specified period by such authorities. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 141 by Powell

Florida Enterprise Zone Act; Revises date of repeal of Florida Enterprise Zone Act. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 4001 by Rehwinkel Vasilinda

Nuclear and Integrated Gasification Combined Cycle Power Plants; Repeals provisions for cost recovery mechanisms for siting, design, licensing, & construction of nuclear & integrated gasification combined cycle power plants, including mechanisms that promote utility investment in, & allow for recovery in electric utility rates of certain costs of, such plants. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 4003 by Williams, A., Watson, C. (Identical SB 116)

Use of Deadly Force in Defense of a Person; Repeals provisions relating to home protection & use of deadly force, which created presumption of fear of death or great bodily harm in certain circumstances & provided that person has no duty to retreat & has right to stand his or her ground & meet force with force in certain circumstances; conforms provisions. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 4005 by Gaetz

Fireworks; Repeals provisions relating to testing & approval of sparklers & registration of manufacturers, distributors, wholesalers, & retailers of sparklers; repeals provisions relating to sale & use of fireworks; repeals provisions relating to bond of licensees; conforms provisions. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 4007 by Diaz, J.

Duties of Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Repeals requirement that DACS represent Florida in Southern States Energy Compact. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HCR 8001 by Berman, Castor Dentel, Clarke-Reed, Cruz, Edwards, Kerner, Pafford, Pritchett, Rader, Rogers, Saunders, Schwartz, Slosberg, Stark, Stewart, Torres, Waldman, Watson, C. (Identical SCR 68)

Equal Rights for Men and Women; Ratifies proposed amendment to U.S. Constitution relating to equal rights for men & women

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
