Court-appointed Counsel; Eliminating the limited registry for private counsel willing to accept a flat fee; establishing the Cross-Circuit Conflict Representation Pilot Program in specified offices of the public defender and offices of criminal conflict and civil regional counsel; increasing the statutory caps for certain flat fees in criminal cases, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Bicycle and Pedestrian Ways; Authorizing the Department of Transportation to use appropriated funds for the establishment of a statewide system of interconnected multiuse trails; prioritizing projects for funding; requiring funded projects to be included in the department's work program; providing that the department is not responsible for or obligated to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of any such project, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Effective Date: July 1, 2014

memoranda of understanding between approved tax collectors & DOACS; provides for remission of revenue to DOACS; provides for retention of specified fees by tax collectors; prohibits tax collectors from maintaining certain lists; prohibits persons from receiving compensation for handling such applications unless authorized. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Effective Date: July 1, 2014
