HB 7181 by State Affairs Committee, Boyd, Caldwell
(Compare HB 509, HB 5005, HB 7173, HB 7179, SB 184,
CS/SB 246, CS/SB 1114, SB 1692)

Public Retirement Plans; Provides that certain members enrolled in FRS are vested in pension plan after 10 years of creditable service; revises provisions relating to compulsory membership in FRS Investment Plan, membership in Elected Officers' Class & Senior Management Service Class, elected official membership eligibility, & Senior Management Service Optional Annuity Program; closes Senior Management Service Optional Annuity Program to new members; revises provisions relating to disability benefits; provides certain members with specified time to choose participation in pension plan or investment plan; revises provisions related to firefighters' & police officers' pension trust fund & pension plans; revises provisions relating to benefits funded from premium tax revenues & defined contribution plans; provides declaration of important state interest. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 117 by Ray, Davis, Fullwood, Jones, M., McBurney
(Identical SB 388)

Public Retirement Plans; Specifies applicability of ch. 185, F.S., to certain consolidated governments; provides that consolidated government that has entered into interlocal agreement to provide police protection services to municipality within its boundaries is eligible to receive premium taxes reported for municipality; authorizes municipality receiving police protection services to enact an ordinance levying tax as provided by law; including certain consolidated governments

under provisions authorizing imposition of state excise tax on casualty insurance premiums covering certain property.
Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Directs Florida Board of Professional Surveyors & Mappers to adopt rules establishing specified standards of practice; revises provisions relating to fingerprint records for private investigative, security, & repossession service licenses; renewal of certain firearm licenses; carrying of specified handguns & concealed firearms; consumer claims against certain bonds posted by health studios, commercial telephone sellers, pawnbrokers, sellers of travel; telephone solicitation; issuance & renewal of permits; administrative fines & civil penalties for pawnbrokers; issuance & renewal of permits; & service & notice for administrative complaints; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/HB 7147 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Energy & Utilities Subcommittee, Diaz, J. (Similar CS/CS/SB 1044, Compare HB 4007)

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services;

Removes provision relating to duty of DOACS to represent state in Southern States Energy Compact; requires DOACS' annual report to include recommendations for energy efficiency; directs DOACS to cooperate with Florida Energy Systems Consortium in development & use of renewable energy resources; authorizes Commissioner of Agriculture to serve on or appoint representative to Southern States Energy Board; redirects authority to approve proposed activities relating to Southern States Energy Compact from DOH to DOACS; authorizes DOACS to post on its website information relating to certain fueling & charging stations & authorizes owners & operators of such stations to report certain information; provides for appointment of DOACS representative to Florida Building Commission; repeals provisions relating to Solar Energy System Incentives Program & energy-efficient appliance rebate program. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 343 by Economic Affairs Committee, Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee, Nuñez, Stewart (Identical CS/CS/SB 484)

Rental Car Surcharge; Provides alternative surcharge for use of motor vehicle pursuant to agreement with car-sharing service for less than specified number of hours; defines term "car-sharing service"; provides for applicability. Effective Date: January 1, 2015

CS/CS/HB 7055 by Judiciary Committee, Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Pilon, Baxley, Brodeur, Campbell, Combee, Harrell, Kerner, Perry, Pritchett, Raschein, Rodrigues, R., Rooney, Spano, Van Zant (Similar CS/CS/SB 700)

Juvenile Justice; Revises numerous provisions relating to juvenile justice; clarifies jurisdictional age restrictions; provides for placement of child in secure detention for contempt of court; revises intake process; requires child to be held in secure detention under certain circumstances; clarifies procedures for releasing child before detention hearing; clarifies when court may order continued detention; revises procedures for transferring child to another detention status; provides new notification requirements when child leaves secure detention; requires DJJ to notify specified parties when child absconds; provides for alternative consequence to address noncompliance with technical probation conditions; expands transition-to-adulthood services to all children; provides for Comprehensive Accountability Report; limits amount DJJ may pay for health care services; provides for criminal penalties for specified employees who inflict neglect upon juvenile offenders; conforms provisions. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 797 by Finance & Tax Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Pilon (Similar CS/SB 788)

Clerks of Court; Authorizes jurors & witnesses to be paid by check; requires party applying for garnishment to pay deposit to garnishee, rather than in registry of court; deletes provision that requires clerk to collect specified fee; provides requirements for sale of tax certificates; revises requirements for redemption of tax certificates; provides circumstances under which land shall be placed on specified list; clarifies notice requirements; provides for excess proceeds relating to unclaimed property; requires clerk to ensure that excess funds are paid according to specified priorities; provides for interpleader actions & award of reasonable fees & costs. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/HB 863 by Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee, Kerner, Campbell, McBurney (Identical CS/SB 876, Compare CS/SB 1046)

Motor Vehicle Crash Reports; Specifies that required statement must be completed & sworn to for each confidential crash report requested. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Pub. Rec./Motor Vehicle Crash Reports; Provides exemption from public records requirements for certain personal contact information contained in motor vehicle crash reports. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 863 or similar legislation takes effect

Residential Properties; Providing that timeshare projects are not subject to annual inspection requirements; providing that a condominium association that does not own any units classified as timeshare projects is not required to apply for or receive a public lodging establishment license; providing that timeshare projects within separate buildings or at separate locations but managed by one licensed agent may be combined in a single license application; authorizing an association to inspect and repair abandoned condominium units; defining the term "previous owner" for purposes of provisions relating to the liability of condominium unit owners for assessments, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 1089 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Raschein (Similar CS/CS/SB 1274, Compare CS/CS/SB 1672)

Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; Extending the date after which certain structures cease to be eligible for coverage by the corporation; providing that a condominium is deemed ineligible for commercial residential wind-only coverage under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 7037 by Judiciary Committee, Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Spano, Campbell, Combee, Passidomo (Similar CS/CS/SB 1466)

Residential Communities; Revises term "community association management"; provides that community association manager is liable to same extent as officer or director; authorizes indemnification of community association manager or community association management firm under certain conditions; authorizes reasonable charges to be imposed for collection of delinquent assessment; requires release of lien, pre-foreclosure notice, & pre-lien notice to be in specific form;

authorizes reasonable charges to be imposed for collection of delinquent assessment; deletes provision providing for expiration of certain liens; revises notice requirements; provides for content of recording notice. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 1363 by State Affairs Committee, Agriculture & Natural Resources Subcommittee, Van Zant (Similar CS/CS/SB 1594)

Vessel Safety; Provides for FWCC & certain law enforcement agencies or officers to relocate or remove vessels that constitute navigation hazard or interfere with another vessel. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/HB 3531 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Gibbons (Similar SB 54)

Relief/Ronald Miller/City of Hollywood; Provides for appropriation to compensate Ronald Miller for injuries sustained as result of negligence of employee of City of Hollywood; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read second time April 24

HB 3529 by Raburn (Identical SB 56)

Relief/Carl Abbott/Palm Beach County School District; Provides for appropriation to compensate Carl Abbott for injuries sustained as result of negligence of Palm Beach County School District; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read second time April 24

HB 3519 by Santiago (Identical SB 52)

Relief/Monica Cantillo Acosta & Luis Alberto Cantillo Acosta/Miami-Dade County; Provides for appropriation to compensate Monica Cantillo Acosta & Luis Alberto Cantillo Acosta, surviving children of Nhora Acosta, for wrongful death of mother due to injuries sustained as result of negligence of Miami-Dade County bus driver; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/HB 227 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Kerner, Campbell, Fullwood, Gibbons, Rogers, Watson, C., Williams, A. (Similar CS/CS/SB 326)

Victims of Wrongful Incarceration; Provides that wrongfully incarcerated person who was convicted & sentenced to death on or before December 31, 1979, is exempt from certain application procedures for compensation if special prosecutor issues nolle prosequi after reviewing conviction; provides alternative application procedures; requires claimant to file application within specified time; requires application to include certain information & documents; provides that claimant is entitled to compensation if requirements met; prohibits compensation from being used for specified fees & costs; provides for repeal on specified date; requires CFO to issue payment to insurance company or other financial institution authorized to issue annuity contracts to purchase annuity or annuities selected by wrongfully incarcerated person; requires CFO to execute all necessary agreements; requires wrongfully incarcerated person to sign waiver before application approved. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Human Trafficking; Clarifying the offense of human trafficking; prohibiting the employment of minors in adult theaters; eliminating the statute of limitations for prosecutions under a specified human trafficking provision; repealing provisions relating to procuring a person under the age of 18 for prostitution, selling or buying of minors into prostitution, and reclassification of certain violations involving minors, respectively; providing for expunction of criminal history records of certain criminal charges against victims of human trafficking that did not result in convictions, etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

CS/CS/CS/HB 487 by Appropriations Committee, Agriculture & Natural Resources Subcommittee, Higher Education & Workforce Subcommittee, Raburn, Albritton, Artilles, Raulerson, Santiago, Van Zant (Similar CS/SB 1206)

Agricultural Industry Certifications; Requires DOACS to annually provide to SBE & DOE industry certifications for farm occupations to be considered for placement on industry certification funding lists; defines industry certification as part of career education programs; requires rules for implementing industry certification process for farm occupations. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Read second time April 24

HB 7171 by State Affairs Committee, Brodeur, Porter (Identical SB 1748)

Establishing Minimum Water Flows and Levels for Water Bodies; Exempting specified rules from legislative ratification under certain provisions; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to publish a certain notice, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/CS/HB 811 by Appropriations Committee, Government Operations Subcommittee, Hager (Similar CS/CS/SB 948)

Foreign Investments; Revises & provides definitions with respect to requirements that SBA divest securities in which public moneys are invested in certain companies doing specified types of business in or with Sudan or Iran; revises exclusions from divestment requirements; conforms cross-references; requires insurers to identify & report specified investments; provides severability. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/HB 7095 by Appropriations Committee, Economic Affairs Committee, Patronis, Campbell, Taylor (Compare CS/CS/SB 1216)

Professional Sports Facilities Incentive Application Process; Providing for the distribution of a specified amount of tax proceeds to certain applicants of the professional sports facility incentive program; authorizing municipalities and counties to use local government half-cent sales tax distributions to reimburse the state for funding received under the professional sports facility incentive program; creating the professional sports facility incentive program; requiring a local government to issue an emergency declaration in order to designate a professional sports facility constructed with financial assistance from the state as a shelter site for the homeless, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

HB 799 by Magar (Similar SB 1486, Compare CS/CS/CS/HB 573)

Transitional Living Facilities; Creates part XI, ch. 400, F.S., relating to transitional living facilities; provides requirements with respect to licensure, policies & procedures, client admission & care, screening of employees, recordkeeping, & safekeeping of client property & funds; provides penalties for violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Read second time April 24

CS/CS/CS/HB 819 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Health Quality Subcommittee, Pigman, Campbell (Similar CS/CS/SB 1066, Compare CS/CS/HB 1225, CS/SB 1352, CS/SB 1470)

Department of Health; Authorizes DHSMV to provide reproductions of specified records to DOH; specifies notification & consent procedures for performing HIV test in health care setting & nonhealth care setting; provides that member of public may not be charged for certain examinations, investigations, or autopsies; clarifies DOH duties to maintain confidentiality of certain patient records; authorizes licensees under investigation to inspect or receive copies of certain patient records; revises certain fees & rates; revises certain continuing education requirements for Board of Medicine licensees; revises provisions related to professions including certified nursing assistants, dental laboratory operators, midwives, registered dietitians, nursing home administrators, & massage therapy apprentices; requires health care provider to continue to be agent for specified period after ineligibility. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 1131 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health Quality Subcommittee, Hudson, Boyd, Cummings, Pigman, Renuart, Young (Similar CS/CS/SB 1122)

Emergency Allergy Treatment; Expands provisions to apply to all emergency allergy reactions, rather than to insect bites only; authorizes certain health care practitioners to prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors to authorized entity; authorizes such entities to maintain supply of epinephrine auto-injectors; authorizes certified individuals to use epinephrine auto-injectors; authorizes uncertified individuals to use epinephrine auto-injectors under certain circumstances; provides immunity from liability. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 1179 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health Innovation Subcommittee, Stone (Similar CS/CS/SB 976)
