Effective Date: on the same date that HB 5 or similar legislation takes effect

continued review of necessity of guardianships for young adults; requires updated case plan developed in face-to-face conference with child, if appropriate, & other specified persons; provides requirements for DCF when court determines there is good faith basis to appoint guardian; requires DCF to provide specified information if another interested party initiates proceedings; provides that guardianship court has jurisdiction over proceedings for appointment of guardian advocate if petitions are filed for certain minors subject to ch. 39, F.S., proceedings when such minors have reached specified age; provides that such minor has same due process rights as certain adults; provides that if child is subject to proceedings under ch. 39, F.S., parents may act as natural guardians unless court finds that it is not in child's best interests or parental rights have been terminated. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

Disabled Parking; Revises provisions that allow counties & municipalities to charge fees for vehicles displaying disabled parking permit at certain timed parking facilities; excludes vehicles displaying "DV" license plate issued to certain disabled veterans from payment of such fees. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/CS/HB 1055 by Health & Human Services Committee, Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee, Harrell, Artiles (Compare CS/CS/SB 760)

Child Protection; Provides requirements for representation of Children's Medical Services on multiagency teams investigating certain child deaths or other serious incidents; requires Statewide Medical Director for Child Protection & district medical directors to hold certain qualifications; requires DOH to approve third-party credentialing entity; specifies that child protection team members are covered by state sovereign immunity provisions when carrying out their duties; provides that physician who holds expert witness certificate may provide expert testimony in criminal child abuse & neglect cases. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Discounts on Public Park Entrance Fees & Transportation Fares; Requires counties & municipalities to provide discounts on public park entrance fees to military members, veterans, & spouses & parents of certain deceased military members, law enforcement officers, firefighters, & emergency workers; requires regional transportation authorities to provide discounts on fares & charges to certain disabled veterans; defines "park entrance fees." Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Appointment of an Ad Litem; Defines "ad litem"; authorizes court to appoint ad litem for party upon whom service of process by publication is made; prohibits court from appointing ad litem to represent interest for which personal representative, guardian of property, or trustee is serving; requires ad litem, upon discovery that party it represents is already represented, to take certain actions; prohibits court from requiring ad litem to post bond or designate resident agent; requires court to discharge ad litem when final judgment is entered or as otherwise ordered by court; provides that ad litem is entitled to award of reasonable fee for services & costs & provides for assessment; prohibits declaring court-appointed ad litem ineffective solely due to lack of statutory authority for appointment; provides that section does not abrogate court's common law authority to appoint ad litem. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Mental Health Services in the Criminal Justice System;

Expands eligibility for military veterans & servicemembers for certain programs; authorizes creation of treatment-based mental health court programs; authorizes person eligible for participation in problem-solving court to transfer case to another county's problem-solving court; authorizes county court to order conditional release of defendant for outpatient care & treatment; authorizes Forensic Hospital Diversion Pilot Program in specified judicial circuits; provides for courts to order certain defendants on probation or community control to postadjudicatory mental health court programs; expands eligibility requirements for certain pretrial intervention programs; provides eligibility of misdemeanor defendants for misdemeanor pretrial mental health court programs; authorizes pretrial mental health court programs for certain juvenile offenders. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

State Lands; Revises criteria for land management goals & management plan updates; requires Division of State Lands to review conservation & nonconservation lands to determine if such lands could support low-impact agriculture or be disposed of; provides for low-impact agriculture agreements; requires

Acquisition & Restoration Council to provide certain recommendations; directs Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund to dispose of lands under certain conditions; provides for certain state-owned lands to be exchanged for certain privately owned land; directs DEP to include certain lands in database; requires local governments to submit certain information to DEP; requires council to give priority funding consideration to certain projects; provides for inclusion of certain projects; directs DEP to consolidate specified parcels of conservation lands; provides appropriations & authorizes positions. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Department of Transportation; Revises provisions relating to DOT's organization, Uniform Traffic Control Law, driving on right side of roadway, crosswalks, operating bicycle, commercial motor vehicles, airport zoning, traveler information systems, toll revenue, bonds, toll accounts, adopted work program, transportation concurrency; & directs EDR to determine benefits of investment in DOT's adopted work program. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/CS/HB 7075 by Economic Affairs Committee, Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee, Transportation & Ports Subcommittee, Rooney (Compare CS/CS/HB 231, CS/HB 1101, CS/HB 7039, SB 194, CS/CS/SB 1024, CS/SB 1184, CS/SB 1186, SB 1254, CS/SB 1554)

Transportation; Provides criteria for transportation services procurement and for governing body of independent special district regulating the operation of public vehicles; revises penalties for traffic offenses; revises provisions relating to prohibition of viewer or screen visible from driver's seat of motor vehicle, vehicles following too close, oversize loads, vehicle length, port vehicles, DOT responsibilities, surety bonds, turnpike revenue, the adopted work program, long-range transportation plans, small county outreach, the Strategic Intermodal System Plan, the Central Florida Expressway Authority; removes provisions for statewide transportation corridors. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/CS/HB 921 by Judiciary Committee, Business & Professions Subcommittee, Trujillo (Compare CS/SB 1048)

Motor Vehicle Manufacturers, Factory Branches, Distributors, Importers, & Dealers; Revises provisions that prohibit & limit audits of certain payments & denial or reduction of such payments; revises provisions that restrict adverse action against dealer when vehicle that was delivered to customer is resold or exported out of state; prohibits failing to make payment for replacement vehicle provided by dealer to customer; & prohibits requiring dealer to make certain payments for advertising. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Business & Professions Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute
