HB 7143 by State Affairs Committee, Caldwell, Passidomo, Williams, A., Watson, C. (Similar HB 227, CS/SB 228, Compare HB 1161, SB 7064)

Online Voter Registration; Requires DOS to develop online voter registration system; provides application & security requirements; requires system to compare information submitted online with DHSMV records; provides for disposition of voter registration applications; requires system compliance with federal accessibility provisions; requires division to report to Legislature regarding implementation by specified date.
Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 19 by Appropriations Committee, Steube, Costello, Diaz, M., Eagle, Raburn, Renuart, Smith (Similar SB 180)

School Safety; Permits school superintendent, with approval of the school board, to authorize school safety designee to carry concealed weapon or firearm on school property; provides requirements for school safety designees; provides exception to prohibition on possession of firearms or other specified devices on school property or other specified areas; provides for fingerprint processing & retention; requires that fees be borne by school safety designee or school; requires school boards to formulate policies & procedures for dealing with active shooters & hostage situations in consultation with law enforcement; requires district school boards & private schools allow campus tours by local law enforcement agencies for specified purposes & that their recommendations be documented; permits district school boards to commission one or more school safety officers on each school campus. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Out-of-State Fee Waivers for Veterans and Dependents; Revises Congressman C. W. "Bill" Young Veteran Tuition Waiver Program to include out-of-state fee waivers for certain individuals receiving specified federal educational benefits. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Higher Education & Workforce Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Veteran & Military Affairs Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 51 by Highway & Waterway Safety Subcommittee, Murphy, Jenne, Pafford, Smith, Watson, C. (Similar CS/SB 132)

Disabled Parking Permits; Authorizes veterans to provide DHSMV alternative documentation for renewal or replacement of disabled parking permit. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Highway & Waterway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 65 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Steube, Mayfield, Van Zant, Williams, A. (Identical CS/SB 826, Compare CS/CS/SB 824)

Public Records & Public Meetings; Provides exemption from public records requirements & public meetings requirements for unsolicited proposals held by responsible public entity for specified period; provides definition; requires that recording be

made of closed meeting; provides exemption from public records requirements for records generated during closed meeting for specified period; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 63 or similar legislation takes effect

Missing Persons with Special Needs; Creates pilot project in specified counties to provide personal assistive technology devices to persons with special needs to aid search-and-rescue efforts; provides for administration of project; requires reports; provides for expiration. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

HB 85 by Hill, Diaz, M., Gaetz (Identical SB 358)

Public School Instruction; Requires that instructional staff of public schools provide instruction to students about terrorist attacks occurring on September 11, 2001, & impact of those events. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

K-12 Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/HB 91 by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Pilon (Identical CS/CS/SB 564, Compare CS/CS/SB 566)

Trade Secrets; Includes financial information in provisions prohibiting theft, embezzlement, or unlawful copying of trade secrets. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/CS/HB 93 by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Pilon (Similar CS/CS/SB 566, Compare CS/CS/SB 564)

Pub. Rec./Trade Secrets; Expands public records exemptions to incorporate changes to definition of "trade secret" by CS/CS/HB 91; provides for future legislative review & repeal;

provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: on the same date that CS/CS/HB 91 or similar legislation relating to trade secrets takes effect

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

HB 109 by Broxson, Gaetz, Hill (Identical SB 184, Compare HB 1161)

Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot; Authorizes absent uniformed services voters & overseas voters to use federal write-in absentee ballot in state or local election; authorizes elector to vote on ballot measure in election using federal write-in absentee ballot; specifies that vote cast in judicial merit retention election is treated in same manner as vote on certain ballot measures; allows for minor variations in name of ballot measure; prohibits supervisor of elections from canvassing federal write-in absentee ballots from overseas voters in certain elections until specified period after date of election; revises minimum requirements for DOS rules used to determine what constitutes valid vote on federal write-in absentee ballot. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 111 by Health Innovation Subcommittee, Magar (Similar CS/SB 682)

Transitional Living Facilities; Creates part XI, ch. 400, F.S., relating to transitional living facilities; provides requirements with respect to licensure, policies & procedures, client admission & care, screening of employees, recordkeeping, & safekeeping of client property & funds; provides penalties for violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Health Innovation Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/CS/HB 113 by State Affairs Committee, Local Government Affairs Subcommittee, Government Operations Subcommittee, Perry, Broxson, Van Zant (Similar CS/CS/SB 778)

Local Government Construction Preferences; Prohibits local ordinances & regulations from restricting competition for award of construction services based upon certain conditions; requires state college, school district, or other political subdivision to make specified disclosures in competitive solicitation documents. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Local Government Affairs Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Appropriations Committee: Favorable; State Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

HB 115 by Gaetz (Identical SB 732)

Sentencing; Redefines "victim" for purposes of restitution provisions to include governmental entities & political subdivisions; requires sentencing judge to order restitution & specified number of community service work hours for violations of provisions relating to bribery & misuse of public office & offenses by public officers & employees. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

HB 117 by Watson, B., Watson, C. (Identical SB 1010)

False Personation; Revises list of officials who are prohibited from being falsely personated; prohibits sale or transfer of specified badges bearing in any manner or combination words "fire department" & ownership or operation of vehicles marked or identified by words "fire department"; requires specified intent for certain offenses; provides exception. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

HB 137 by Rader, Cummings, Edwards, Sullivan, Van Zant (Similar SB 158)

Civil Liability of Farmers; Revises exemption from civil liability for certain farmers; revises applicability of exemption. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Civil Justice Subcommittee: Favorable; Agriculture & Natural Resources Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 141 by Health Quality Subcommittee, Stevenson, Adkins (Similar CS/SB 144)

Pub. Rec./Impaired Practitioner Consultants; Provides exemption from public records requirements for certain identifying & location information of impaired practitioner consultants & their employees retained by agency & spouses & children of such consultants & employees; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Health Quality Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

HB 143 by Bileca, Baxley, Combee, Cortes, B., Costello, Cummings, Diaz, M., Gaetz, Harrell, Hill, McBurney, Perry, Pilon, Rehwinkel Vasilinda, Rouson, Spano, Stone, Van Zant, Wood (Similar SB 352)

American Founders' Month; Designates September as "American Founders' Month"; authorizes Governor to annually designate month; requires district school boards to celebrate

American Founders by observing American Founders' Month; provides that instruction may be integrated into existing school curriculum. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

K-12 Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 151 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Goodson, Harrell, Jenne (Compare CS/CS/SB 538)

Sexual Cyberharassment; Prohibits person from willfully & maliciously sexually cyberharassing another person; authorizes law enforcement officer to arrest, without warrant, person that he or she has probable cause to believe has committed sexual cyberharassment; authorizes search warrant to be issued in specified instances; provides civil remedies; provides exceptions; authorizes law enforcement officer to arrest, without warrant, person that he or she has probable cause to believe has committed sexual cyberharassment; provides exception to prohibition on search warrants being issued to search private dwellings. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

CS/HB 153 by Choice & Innovation Subcommittee, Lee, Bracy, Cortes, J., Fitzenhagen, Geller, Hager, Harrell, Mayfield, Moraitis, Perry, Powell, Rehwinkel Vasilinda, Santiago, Slosberg, Watson, C. (Similar SB 1116)

Literacy Jump Start Pilot Project; Requires Office of Early Learning to establish pilot project in St. Lucie County to assist low-income, at-risk children in developing emergent literacy skills; requires OEL to select organization to implement pilot project; provides eligibility requirements for participation; requires background screening for childcare personnel; requires OEL to allocate funds for pilot project. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Choice & Innovation Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Education Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/CS/HB 175 by Judiciary Committee, Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Spano, Stone (Similar CS/CS/CS/SB 222)

Electronic Commerce; Creates "Computer Abuse & Data Recovery Act"; prohibits person from intentionally committing specified acts without authorization with respect to protected computer; provides penalties for violation; specifies remedies for civil actions brought by persons affected by violation; provides that specified criminal judgments or decrees against defendant act as estoppel as to certain matters in specified civil actions; provides that specified civil actions must be filed within certain periods of time; provides that act does not prohibit specified activity by certain governmental agencies or impose liability on certain technology service providers. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

CS/HB 179 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Eagle, Artiles, Cruz, Gaetz, Pilon, Van Zant (Similar CS/SB 200)

Public Records/Tax Collectors; Provides public records exemption for e-mail addresses obtained by tax collector for certain purposes; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Local Government Affairs Subcommittee: Favorable; Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Finance & Tax Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 181 by K-12 Subcommittee, Bileca, Costello, Diaz, M. (Similar SB 448)

Educational Facilities; Provides for school district construction flexibility; authorizes exceptions to educational facilities construction requirements under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

K-12 Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Education Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 201 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Narain, DuBose, Pafford, Van Zant (Similar CS/SB 746)

Diabetes Awareness Training for Law Enforcement Officers; Designates act the "Arthur Green, Jr., Act"; requires FDLE to establish online continued employment training component relating to diabetic emergencies; specifies topics to be included; provides that completion of training may count towards continued employment instruction requirements. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

HB 221 by Drake (Identical SB 520)

Long-Term Care Insurance; Provides additional forms for mandatory offer of nonforfeiture benefits in long-term care insurance policies. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable; Health Innovation Subcommittee: Favorable; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/HB 223 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Higher Education & Workforce Subcommittee, Combee, Spano (Similar CS/CS/SB 182)

Public Records and Meetings/Postsecondary Education Executive Search; Provides exemption from public records requirements for identifying information of applicant for president or provost of state university or Florida College
